FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

HB 1330: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 51 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to prohibiting covered entities from selling users' protected data without consent; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Industry, Business and Labor Committee.

Reps. Porter, Toman and Sen. D. Larsen introduced:

HB 1331: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 5 of section 40-06-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the number of members of a city governing body; and to repeal section 40-12-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to initiating and referring a municipal ordinance.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

Reps. Kreidt, Bellew and Sen. Lee introduced:

HB 1332: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 23-09.3-01.1 and subsection 1 of section 23-16-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the moratorium on basic care and nursing facility bed capacity.

Was read the first time and referred to the Human Services Committee.

Reps. Jones, Ertelt, Fegley, Kasper, Schauer introduced:

HB 1333: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-44.6 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to requiring state agencies to include an

"American" classification on state forms requesting racial information.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Reps. Jones, Fegley, Heinert, Klemin, Strinden, Vigesaa and Sen. Kannianen introduced:

HB 1334: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 28-26-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to requiring a court to determine if a claim for relief was frivolous.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Reps. Kempenich, Bellew, Jones, Kading, M. Ruby, Simons and Sens. O. Larsen, Myrdal introduced:

HB 1335: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reservation of powers not granted to the federal government.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Reps. D. Johnson, Jones, Karls, Satrom and Sens. Larson, Luick, Myrdal introduced:

HB 1336: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-08-01.6 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to sealing a criminal record of a driving under the influence offense.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

Reps. D. Johnson, Monson, Richter and Sens. Myrdal, Rust, Schaible introduced:

HB 1337: A BILL for an Act to create and enact subsection 5 of section 57-15-17 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the authority of a school district to transfer funds from the building fund to another political subdivision; and to amend and reenact subsections 6 and 9 of section 15.1-09-33 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers of a school board.

Was read the first time and referred to the Political Subdivisions Committee.

Rep. Trottier introduced:

HB 1338: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 4.1-33-16 and a

new section to chapter 4.1-33 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the waiver of certification requirements during a declared state of emergency and an exemption to certification requirements for antimicrobial pesticides; and to amend and reenact section 4.1-33-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of antimicrobial pesticide.

Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture Committee.

The House stood adjourned pursuant to Representative Louser's motion.
