- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 39-03.1-09, subsection 2 of
- 2 section 52-11-01, sections 54-52-06.1, 54-52-06.2, and 54-52-06.4, and subsection 1 of section
- 3 54-52.6-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to employee contributions for state
- 4 retirement programs; and to provide compensation adjustments.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-03.1-09 of the North Dakota
  Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - Every member, except as provided in section 39-03.1-07, shall contribute into the fund ten and thirty-hundredths percent of the member's monthly salary, which sum must be deducted from the member's salary and credited to the member's account in the fund. Member contributions increase by one percent of the member's monthly salary beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2012; with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2013; with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2014; with an additional increase of one-half of one percent, beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2022; with an additional increase of one-half of one percent, beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2023; with an additional increase of one-half of one percent, beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2024; and with an additional increase of one-half of one percent, beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2025. Beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2025. Beginning with the monthly reporting period of August 2023, the state shall pay the member contribution under this subsection.
  - **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 52-11-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

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The employing agency shall be authorized to withhold the employee's share of the contributions required under such retirement program from the salary paid each employee of such agency. The amount of such withholding must be an adjustable percentage rate of the employee's salary sufficient to provide financing of the required employee's contributions to such retirement plan as such plan was originally contracted and as it has been or will be amended, provided that such percentage rate may not exceed the percentage rate which may be fixed for withholding from federal employees for employee contributions to the federal retirement program under civil service. The employing agency shall be authorized to pay a sum as prescribed in the program contract toward the cost of such retirement program, which sum may not be in excess of the amount approved by the appropriate federal agency supervising the payment or reimbursement of salary and retirement program costs. The amount withheld from the wages due an employee and the amount to be paid by the employing agency must be paid to the company holding such retirement program contract in accordance with the terms of such contract. Beginning with the monthly reporting period of August 2023, the state shall pay the employee's contribution under this subsection.

**SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-52-06.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 54-52-06.1. Contribution by supreme and district court judges - Employer contribution.

Each judge of the supreme or district court who is a member of the public employees retirement system must be assessed and required to pay monthly five percent of the judge's monthly salary. Member contributions increase by one percent of the judge's monthly salary beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2012, and with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the reporting period of January 2013, and with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2014. The assessment must be deducted and retained out of the judge's salary in equal monthly installments. The state shall contribute an amount equal to fourteen and fifty-two one-hundredths percent of the monthly salary of a supreme or district court judge who is a participating member of the system, which matching contribution must be paid from its funds

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- 1 appropriated for salary, or from any other funds available for such purposes. State contributions
- 2 increase by one percent of the monthly salary of a supreme or district court judge who is a
- 3 participating member of the system beginning with the monthly reporting period of
- 4 January 2012, and with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the monthly
- 5 reporting period of January 2013, and with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with
- 6 the monthly reporting period of January 2014. If the judge's contribution is paid by the state
- 7 under subsection 3 of section 54-52-05, the state shall contribute, in addition, an amount equal
- 8 to the required judge's contribution. <u>Beginning with the monthly reporting period of August 2023,</u>
- 9 the state shall pay the judge's contribution under this section.
- SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - 54-52-06.2. Contribution by national guard security officers or firefighters Employer contribution.

Each national guard security officer or firefighter who is a member of the public employees retirement system is assessed and shall pay monthly four percent of the employee's monthly salary. Member contributions increase by one-half of one percent of the member's monthly salary beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2014. Effective August 1, 2015, each national guard security officer or firefighter who is a participating member of the plan under this section becomes a participating member of the plan under section 54-52-06.4 and the board shall thereafter manage any account balance associated with those participating members under section 54-52-06.4. After July 31, 2015, a new eligible employee may not become a participating member of the plan under this section. The assessment must be deducted and retained out of the employee's salary in equal monthly installments. The national guard security officer's or firefighter's employer shall contribute an amount determined by the board to be actuarially required to support the level of benefits specified in section 54-52-17. The employer's contribution must be paid from funds appropriated for salary or from any other funds available for such purposes. If the security officer's or firefighter's assessment is paid by the employer under subsection 3 of section 54-52-05, the employer shall contribute, in addition, an amount equal to the required national guard security officer's or firefighter's assessment. Beginning with the monthly reporting period of August 2023, the state shall pay the security officer and firefighter contributions under this section.

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- SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 54-52-06.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 54-52-06.4. Contribution by peace officers employed by the bureau of criminal investigation or security officers employed by the national guard Employer contribution.

Each peace officer employed by the bureau of criminal investigation who is a member of the public employees retirement system is assessed and shall pay monthly four percent of the employee's monthly salary. Peace officer contributions increase by one percent of the member's monthly salary beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2012, and with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the reporting period of January 2013. Effective August 1, 2015, each national guard security officer who is a member of the public employee's retirement system is assessed and monthly shall pay six percent of the employee's monthly salary. National guard security officer contributions decrease by one-half of one percent of the member's monthly salary beginning with the monthly reporting period of January 2016. The assessment must be deducted and retained out of the employee's salary in equal monthly installments. The peace officer's or security officer's employer shall contribute an amount determined by the board to be actuarially required to support the level of benefits specified in section 54-52-17. The employer's contribution must be paid from funds appropriated for salary or from any other funds available for such purposes. If the peace officer's or security officer's assessment is paid by the employer under subsection 3 of section 54-52-05, the employer shall contribute, in addition, an amount equal to the required peace officer's or security officer's assessment. Beginning with the monthly reporting period of August 2023, the state shall pay the peace officer and security officer contributions under this section.

**SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 54-52.6-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1. Each participating member shall contribute monthly four percent of the monthly salary or wage paid to the participant, and this assessment must be deducted from the participant's salary in equal monthly installments commencing with the first month of participation in the defined contribution retirement plan established under this chapter. Participating member contributions increase by one percent of the monthly salary or wage paid to the participant beginning with the monthly reporting period of

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1	January 2012; with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with the reporting
2	period of January 2013; and with an additional increase of one percent, beginning with
3	the monthly reporting period of January 2014. Beginning with the monthly reporting
4	period of August 2023, the state shall pay the participating member contribution under
5	this section for each participating member who is an employee of the state.
6	SECTION 7. STATE EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION ADJUSTMENTS. The 2023-25
7	biennium compensation adjustments for permanent state employees are to equal four percent
8	per eligible employee for the first fiscal year of the biennium and are to equal four percent per
9	eligible employee for the second year of the biennium. The increases for the first year of the
10	biennium are to be given beginning with the month of July 2023, to be paid in August 2023, and
11	for the second year of the biennium are to be given beginning with the month of July 2024, to be
12	paid in August 2024.
