- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 47-37 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 2 to the Uniform Environmental Covenants Act.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 47-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 6 **47-37-01. Definitions.**
- 7 <u>1. "Activity and use limitations" means restrictions or obligations created under this</u> 8 chapter with respect to real property.
- "Agency" means the department of environmental quality or any other state or federal
 agency that determines or approves the environmental response project pursuant to
 which the environmental covenant is created.
- 3. "Common interest community" means a condominium, cooperative, or other real
 property with respect to which a person, by virtue of the person's ownership of a
 parcel of real property, is obligated to pay property taxes or insurance premiums, or for
 maintenance, or improvement of other real property described in a recorded covenant
- 16 <u>that creates the common interest community.</u>
- 4. "Environmental covenant" means a servitude arising under an environmental response
 project that imposes activity and use limitations.
- 19 <u>5.</u> "Environmental response project" means a plan or work performed for environmental
 20 remediation of real property and conducted:
- 21 <u>a. Under a federal or state program governing environmental remediation of real</u>
 22 <u>property, including chapters 23.1-04, 23.1-08, and 61-28;</u>
- b. Incident to closure of a solid or hazardous waste management unit, if the closure
 is conducted with approval of an agency; or

1 <u>Under a state voluntary cleanup program authorized in section 23.1-04-04.</u> 2 "Holder" means the grantee of an environmental covenant as specified in subsection 1 <u>6.</u> 3 of section 47-37-02. "Person" means an individual, corporation, business trust, estate, trust, partnership, 4 <u>7.</u> 5 limited liability company, association, joint venture, public corporation, government, 6 governmental subdivision, agency, or instrumentality, or any other legal or commercial 7 entity. 8 "Record", used as a noun, means information inscribed on a tangible medium or <u>8.</u> 9 stored in an electronic or other medium and which is retrievable in perceivable form. 10 "State" means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the 9. 11 United States Virgin Islands, or any territory or insular possession subject to the 12 jurisdiction of the United States. 13 47-37-02. Nature of rights - Subordination of interests. 14 Any person, including a person that owns an interest in the real property, the agency, 15 or a municipality or other unit of local government, may be a holder. An environmental 16 covenant may identify more than one holder. The interest of a holder is an interest in 17 real property. 18 <u>2.</u> A right of an agency under this chapter or under an environmental covenant, other 19 than a right as a holder, is not an interest in real property. 20 An agency is bound by any obligation it assumes in an environmental covenant, but an <u>3.</u> 21 agency does not assume obligations merely by signing an environmental covenant. 22 Any other person that signs an environmental covenant is bound by the obligations the 23 person assumes in the covenant, but signing the covenant does not change 24 obligations, rights, or protections granted or imposed under law other than this chapter 25 except as provided in the covenant. 26 The following rules apply to interests in real property in existence at the time an <u>4.</u> 27 environmental covenant is created or amended: 28 An interest that has priority under other law is not affected by an environmental 29 covenant unless the person that owns the interest subordinates that interest to

1		<u>b.</u>	This chapter does not require a person that owns a prior interest to subordinate
2			that interest to an environmental covenant or to agree to be bound by the
3			covenant.
4		<u>C.</u>	A subordination agreement may be contained in an environmental covenant
5			covering real property or in a separate record. If the environmental covenant
6			covers commonly owned property in a common interest community, the record
7			may be signed by any person authorized by the governing board of the owners'
8			association.
9		<u>d.</u>	An agreement by a person to subordinate a prior interest to an environmental
10			covenant affects the priority of that person's interest but does not by itself impose
11			any affirmative obligation on the person with respect to the environmental
12			covenant.
13	<u>47-3</u>	<u> 37-03</u>	. Contents of environmental covenant.
14	<u>1.</u>	<u>An e</u>	environmental covenant must:
15		<u>a.</u>	State the instrument is an environmental covenant executed pursuant to chapter
16			<u>47-37;</u>
17		<u>b.</u>	Contain a legally sufficient description of the real property subject to the
18			covenant;
19		<u>C.</u>	Describe the activity and use limitations on the real property;
20		<u>d.</u>	Identify every holder;
21		<u>e.</u>	Be signed by the agency, every holder, and unless waived by the agency every
22			owner of the fee simple of the real property subject to the covenant; and
23		<u>f.</u>	Identify the name and location of any administrative record for the environmental
24			response project reflected in the environmental covenant.
25	<u>2.</u>	<u>In a</u>	ddition to the information required by subsection 1, an environmental covenant
26		may	contain other information, restrictions, and requirements agreed to by the persons
27		who	signed it, including:
28		<u>a.</u>	Requirements for notice following transfer of a specified interest in, or concerning
29			proposed changes in use of, applications for building permits for, or proposals for
30			any site work affecting the contamination on, the property subject to the
31			covenant;

1		<u>b.</u>	Requirements for periodic reporting describing compliance with the covenant;
2		<u>C.</u>	Rights of access to the property granted in connection with implementation or
3			enforcement of the covenant;
4		<u>d.</u>	A brief narrative description of the contamination and remedy, including the
5			contaminants of concern, the pathways of exposure, limits on exposure, and the
6			location and extent of the contamination;
7		<u>e.</u>	Limitation on amendment or termination of the covenant in addition to those
8			contained in sections 47-37-08 and 47-37-09; and
9		<u>f.</u>	Rights of the holder in addition to its right to enforce the covenant pursuant to
10			section 47-37-10.
11	<u>3.</u>	<u>In a</u>	ddition to other conditions for its approval of an environmental covenant, the
12		<u>age</u>	ncy may require those persons specified by the agency which have interests in the
13		<u>real</u>	property to sign the covenant.
14	<u>47-3</u>	7-04	. Validity - Effect on other instruments.
15	<u>1.</u>	<u>An e</u>	environmental covenant that complies with this chapter runs with the land.
16	<u>2.</u>	<u>An e</u>	environmental covenant that is otherwise effective is valid and enforceable even if:
17		<u>a.</u>	It is not appurtenant to an interest in real property;
18		<u>b.</u>	It can be or has been assigned to a person other than the original holder;
19		<u>C.</u>	It is not of a character that has been recognized traditionally at common law;
20		<u>d.</u>	It imposes a negative burden;
21		<u>e.</u>	It imposes an affirmative obligation on a person having an interest in the real
22			property or on the holder;
23		<u>f.</u>	The benefit or burden does not touch or concern real property:
24		<u>g.</u>	There is no privity of estate or contract;
25		<u>h.</u>	The holder dies, ceases to exist, resigns, or is replaced; or
26		<u>i.</u>	The owner of an interest subject to the environmental covenant and the holder
27			are the same person.
28	<u>3.</u>	<u>An i</u>	nstrument that creates restrictions or obligations with respect to real property that
29		wou	ald qualify as activity and use limitations except for the fact that the instrument was
30		reco	orded before August 1, 2021, is not invalid or unenforceable because of any of the
31		<u>limit</u>	ations on enforcement of interests described in subsection 2 or because it was

1		<u>ider</u>	ntified as an easement, servitude, deed restriction, or other interest. This chapter	
2		doe	s not apply in any other respect to such an instrument.	
3	<u>4.</u>	<u>This</u>	s chapter does not invalidate or render unenforceable any interest, whether	
4		des	ignated as an environmental covenant or other interest, which is otherwise	
5		enfo	orceable under the law of this state.	
6	<u>47-3</u>	7-05	. Relationship to other land-use law.	
7	<u>This</u>	s chapter does not authorize a use of real property which is otherwise prohibited by		
8	zoning, l	by law other than this chapter regulating use of real property, or by a recorded		
9	instrume	nent that has priority over the environmental covenant. An environmental covenant may		
0	prohibit	prohibit or restrict uses of real property which are authorized by zoning or by law other than this		
11	chapter.

3	<u>1.</u>	A co	opy of an environmental covenant must be provided by the persons and in the

5		<u>a.</u>	Each person that signed the covenant;

7			covenant;	
8		<u>C.</u>	Each person in possession of the real property subject to the covenant;	
9		<u>d.</u>	Each municipality or other unit of local government in which real property subject

22	<u>2.</u>	The	e validity of a covenant is not affected by failure to provide a copy of the covenant

25	<u>1.</u>	<u>An</u>	environmental covenant and any amendment or termination of the covenant must	
26		be r	recorded in every county in which any portion of the real property subject to the	
27		cov	enant is located. For purposes of indexing, a holder must be treated as a grantee.	
28	<u>2.</u>	Exc	ept as otherwise provided in subsection 3 of section 47-37-08 an environmental	
29		COV	enant is subject to the laws of this state governing recording and priority of	
30		<u>inte</u>	rests in real property.	

1	<u>47-</u>	37-08. Duration - Amendment by court action.
2	<u>1.</u>	An environmental covenant is perpetual unless it is:
3		a. By its terms limited to a specific duration or terminated by the occurrence of a
4		specific event;
5		b. Terminated by consent pursuant to section 47-37-09;
6		c. Terminated pursuant to subsection 2;
7		d. Terminated by foreclosure of an interest that has priority over the environmental
8		covenant; or
9		e. Terminated or modified in an eminent domain proceeding, but only if:
10		(1) The agency that signed the covenant is a party to the proceeding:
11		(2) All persons identified in subsections 1 and 2 of section 47-37-09 are given
12		notice of the pendency of the proceeding; and
13		(3) The court determines, after hearing, the termination or modification will not
14		adversely affect human health or the environment.
15	<u>2.</u>	If the agency that signed an environmental covenant has determined the intended
16		benefits of the covenant can no longer be realized, a court, under the doctrine of
17		changed circumstances, in an action in which all persons identified in subsections 1
18		and 2 of section 47-37-09 have been given notice, may terminate the covenant or
19		reduce its burden on the real property subject to the covenant. The agency's
20		determination or its failure to make a determination upon request is subject to review
21		pursuant to chapter 28-32.
22	<u>3.</u>	Except as otherwise provided in subsections 1 and 2, an environmental covenant may
23		not be extinguished, limited, or impaired through issuance of a tax deed, foreclosure of
24		a tax lien, or application of the doctrine of adverse possession, prescription,
25		abandonment, waiver, lack of enforcement, or acquiescence, or a similar doctrine.
26	<u>4.</u>	An environmental covenant may not be extinguished, limited, or impaired by
27		application of chapters 38-18.1 and 47-19.1.
28	<u>47-</u>	37-09. Amendment or termination by consent.
29	<u>1.</u>	An environmental covenant may be amended or terminated by consent only if the
30		amendment or termination is signed by:
31		a. The agency;

1		<u>b.</u>	Unless waived by the agency, the current owner of the fee simple of the real
2			property subject to the covenant;
3		<u>C.</u>	Each person that originally signed the covenant, unless the person waived in a
4			signed record the right to consent or a court finds the person no longer exists or
5			cannot be located or identified with the exercise of reasonable diligence; and
6		<u>d.</u>	Except as otherwise provided in subdivision b of subsection 4, the holder.
7	<u>2.</u>	<u>If ar</u>	n interest in real property is subject to an environmental covenant, the interest is
8		not	affected by an amendment of the covenant unless the current owner of the interest
9		con	sents to the amendment or has waived in a signed record the right to consent to
10		ame	endments.
11	<u>3.</u>	Exc	ept for an assignment undertaken pursuant to a governmental reorganization,
12		<u>ass</u>	ignment of an environmental covenant to a new holder is an amendment.
13	<u>4.</u>	Exc	ept as otherwise provided in an environmental covenant:
14		<u>a.</u>	A holder may not assign its interest without consent of the other parties;
15		<u>b.</u>	A holder may be removed and replaced by agreement of the other parties
16			specified in subsection 1; and
17		<u>C.</u>	A court of competent jurisdiction may fill a vacancy in the position of holder.
18	<u>47-</u>	<u>37-10</u>	. Enforcement of environmental covenant.
19	<u>1.</u>	A ci	vil action for injunctive or other equitable relief for violation of an environmental
20		COV	enant may be maintained by:
21		<u>a.</u>	A party to the covenant;
22		<u>b.</u>	The agency or, if it is not the agency, the department of environmental quality;
23		<u>C.</u>	Any person to which the covenant expressly grants power to enforce;
24		<u>d.</u>	A person that has interest in the real property or has collateral or liability that may
25			be affected by the alleged violation of the covenant; or
26		<u>e.</u>	A municipality or other unit of local government in which the real property subject
27			to the covenant is located.
28	<u>2.</u>	<u>This</u>	s chapter does not limit the regulatory authority of the agency or the department of
29		<u>env</u>	ironmental quality under law other than this chapter with respect to an
30		env	ironmental response project.

1	<u>3.</u>	<u>A p</u>	erson is not responsible for or subject to liability for environmental remediation		
2		sole	ely because the person has the right to enforce an environmental covenant.

3		rec	ords in lieu of recording the entire covenant. Any such notice must contain:		
4		<u>a.</u>	A legally sufficient description and any available street address of the real		
5			property subject to the covenant:		
6		<u>b.</u>	The name and address of the owner of the fee simple interest in the real property,		
7			the agency, and the holder if other than the agency;		
8		<u>C.</u>	A statement that the covenant, amendment, or termination is available in a		
9			registry at the department of environmental quality, which discloses the method of		
20			any electronic access; and		
21		<u>d.</u>	A statement that the notice is notification of an environmental covenant executed		
22			pursuant to chapter 47-37.		
23	<u>3.</u>	A s	tatement in substantially the following form, executed with the same formalities as a		
24		dee	deed in this state, satisfies the requirements of subsection 2:		
25		<u>a.</u>	This notice is filed in the land records of the (insert political subdivision) of (insert		
26			name of jurisdiction in which the real property is located) pursuant to, section		
27			<u>47-37-11.</u>		
28		<u>b.</u>	This notice and the covenant, amendment, or termination to which it refers may		
29			impose significant obligations with respect to the property described below.
