The 2021-23 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 2023-25 biennium. The parks and recreation department shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 3. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION - REPORTING. In addition to the amounts appropriated in section 1 of this Act, any additional income from federal or other funds that become available are appropriated to the parks and recreation department for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. The department shall report any additional income under this section to the office of management and budget and the legislative council.

SECTION 4. GAME AND FISH OPERATING FUND - TRANSFER - BOAT RAMP OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE. The sum of \$122,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the park operations and maintenance line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act, is from the game and fish operating fund, or federal or other funds available to the game and fish department, and must be transferred to the parks and recreation department as requested by the director of the parks and recreation department for maintenance, operating, and extraordinary repairs expenses relating to boat ramps at state parks for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANT. The estimated income line item in subdivision 3 of section 1 of this Act, includes \$100,000 of grant funding from the department of transportation for the purpose of defraying expenses for the Lewis and Clark interpretive center.

SECTION 6. DEFERRED MAINTENANCE - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND. The park operations and maintenance line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$7,500,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund for deferred maintenance for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 7. INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND. The International Peace Garden line item in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$3,000,000, from the strategic investment and improvements fund for International Peace Garden capital projects or the repayment of any outstanding loan from the Bank of North Dakota

authorized in section 12 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2023. Expenditure of the funds appropriated for this purpose is subject to the province of Manitoba providing funding equal to fifty percent of the total cost of any project paid with the funding referenced in this section.

SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 10 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws is amended and reenacted as follows:

SECTION 10. REQUIREMENTS - MATCHING FUNDS -INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN CAPITAL PROJECTS. The International Peace Garden line item in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act includes \$2,000,000 for capital projects. Expenditure of thesethe funds appropriated for this purpose is subject to one-to-one matching funds being raised from nonstate sourcesthe province of Manitoba providing funding equal to fifty percent of the total cost of any project paid with funding referenced in this section. The parks and recreation department shall review and accept engineering proposals and specifications before committing funds to projects and shall assist with bidding and construction of any work associated with this section. The International Peace Garden shall report quarterly to the parks and recreation department regarding the expenditure of these funds along with the the source of the matching funds. The funds appropriated in this section are not subject to section 54-44.1-11, and may be continued into the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023, for capital projects.

SECTION 9. REPEAL. Section 12 of chapter 44 of the 2019 Session Laws is repealed.

SECTION 10. EXEMPTION - INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN -

REQUIREMENTS. Any funds remaining in the International Peace Garden line item for repair of the peace tower in section 30 of chapter 15 of the 2013 Session Laws are not subject to section 54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds are available for capital projects during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. Funding available for use by the International Peace Garden in this section is subject to the International Peace Garden raising one-to-one matching funds from nonstate sources of North Dakota sources consistent with the 2013 North Dakota legislative language. The parks and recreation department shall review and accept engineering proposals and specifications before committing additional funds to the project and shall assist with bidding and construction of any work associated with this section.

SECTION 11. EXEMPTION - PARK ENHANCEMENTS. Any funds remaining for park enhancements in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 53 of the 2015 Session Laws are not subject to section 54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds are available for park enhancement projects during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 12. EXEMPTION - EXTRAORDINARY REPAIRS. Of the funds appropriated in the parks operation and maintenance line item for extraordinary repairs, \$675,000 in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2017 Sessions Laws is not subject to section 54-44.111, and any unexpended funds are available for extraordinary repairs during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 13. EMERGENCY. The \$3,000,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund appropriated for the International Peace Garden in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act and sections 7, 8, and 9 of this Act are declared to be an emergency measure."

- Amend Section 10 of Senate Bill No. 2019 (2019) to authorize the \$2 million appropriation for International Peace Garden capital projects to be continued into the 2021-23 biennium.
- Repeal Section 12 of Senate Bill No. 2019 (2019) authorizing a Bank of North Dakota loan for International Peace Garden capital projects.
- Allow any funds remaining in the International Peace Garden line item for repair of the Peace Tower in Section 30 of Chapter 15 of the 2013 Session Laws to continue into the 2021-23 biennium. The section also requires the Parks and Recreation Department to review and accept engineering proposals and specifications before committing additional funds to the project.
- Allows any funds remaining for park enhancements from the appropriation in subdivision 1 of Section 1 of Chapter 53 of the 2015 Session Laws to continue and be available for park enhancement projects during the 2021-23 biennium.
- Allow up to \$675,000 of the appropriation for extraordinary repairs in subdivision 1 of Section 1 of Chapter 18
 of the 2017 Sessions Laws to be continued and available for extraordinary repairs during the 2021-23
 biennium.
- Provide an emergency clause.
