- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 corrections and rehabilitation; to provide for a report; to provide a statement of legislative intent;
- 3 to provide for a legislative management study; to provide an exemption; and to declare an
- 4 emergency.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023, as follows:

21	the 2023-25 biennium. The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall report to the		
22	appropriations committees of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time		
23	funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.		
24	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - 2019-21 BIENNIU	JM - FEDERAL C	ORONAVIRUS
25	RELIEF FUND - SPENDING RESTRICTION. There is a	appropriated out o	f any moneys from
26	federal funds derived from the federal coronavirus relief fund, not otherwise appropriated, the		
27	sum of \$43,689,050, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of		
28	corrections and rehabilitation for law enforcement payroll costs, for the period beginning March		
29	2020 and ending June 2021. The funding appropriated in this section replaces existing		
30	legislative appropriations. The department of corrections and rehabilitation may not spend the		

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1 funding appropriated from the general fund for law enforcement payroll costs during the period 2 identified. 3 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - FEDERAL CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND. The 4 estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$18,371,718, or so much 5 of the sum as may be necessary, from the federal coronavirus relief fund for law enforcement 6 payroll costs for the period beginning July 1, 2021, and ending December 31, 2021. 7 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES. 8 It is the intent of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly that the department of corrections and 9 rehabilitation be considered the payer of last resort whenever any other benefit or source of 10 third-party payment, excluding the substance use disorder treatment voucher program, is 11 available for community-based behavioral health services for the biennium beginning July 1, 12 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. It is further the intent of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly 13 that the funding appropriated to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for 14 community-based behavioral health services be utilized prior to utilizing substance use disorder 15 treatment voucher program funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending 16 June 30, 2023. 17 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS 18 AND REHABILITATION LAND USE. During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management 19 shall consider studying the use of land owned by the department of corrections and 20 rehabilitation, including the potential to sell land owned by the department to finance the 21 construction of new correctional facilities. The legislative management shall report its findings 22 and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the 23 recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly. 24 SECTION 7. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION OPERATING 25 FUND REVENUES. Any moneys received by the department of corrections and rehabilitation 26 from correctional supervision, electronic monitoring, and detention; reimbursements from other 27 agencies; profits received from department of corrections and rehabilitation commissary; 28 miscellaneous revenue, including offender fines, fees, restitution, and medical copayments; and 29 from the youth correctional center permanent fund, may be deposited in the department of 30 corrections and rehabilitation operating fund and expended pursuant to legislative appropriation

for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

1	SECTION 8. EXEMPTION - COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROGRAM. The
2	amount of \$7,000,000 from the general fund appropriated for the community behavioral health
3	program in section 1 of chapter 15 of the 2019 Session Laws is not subject to section
4	54-44.1-11, and any unexpended funds from this appropriation may be used for the community
5	behavioral health program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30,
6	2023.
7	SECTION 9. EXEMPTION - DEFERRED MAINTENANCE AND EXTRAORDINARY
8	REPAIRS. Notwithstanding any amount continued under section 4 of this Act, up to \$6,000,000
9	from the general fund appropriated to the department of corrections and rehabilitation in
10	section 1 of chapter 15 of the 2019 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11, and any
11	unexpended funds from this appropriation may be used for deferred maintenance, capital
12	planning, and extraordinary repairs projects by the department of corrections and rehabilitation
13	during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.
14	SECTION 10. EMERGENCY. Section 3 of this Act is declared to be an emergency
15	measure.
