- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-06 of the North Dakota-
- 2 Century Code, relating to electronic operator's licenses; and to amend and reenact sections
- 3 39-06-13 and 39-06-19 and subsection 2 of section 39-06-49 of the North Dakota Century
- 4 Code, relating to operator's license examinations and the renewal of operator's licenses,
- 5 renewals, and fees.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 39-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 8 and enacted as follows: 9 Electronic operator's license. 10 The department shall implement a computerized licensing system that allows a 11 licensed motor vehicle operator to provide electronic proof of valid licensing on an 12 electronic communications device. 13 The electronic proof of valid licensing may be used: 14 a. Upon being stopped by a law enforcement officer for the purpose of enforcing or-15 investigating the possible violation of an ordinance or state law; or 16 b. For identification purposes. 17 .3. <u>A law enforcement officer may not scan, retrieve, or in any other manner request</u> 18 electronic possession of any information contained on a electronic operator's license-19 without permission from the licensed motor vehicle operator.
- 20 <u>If a law enforcement officer requests identification via electronic method, the</u>
- 21 computerized licensing system must display to the licensed motor vehicle operator-
- 22 whether the officer has reasonable suspicion the licensed motor vehicle operator is in-23
 - violation of the law.

3	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
4	amended and reenacted as follows:					
5		0-06-13. Examination of applicants.				
6	1.	Unless otherwise provided in this chapter, the director shall examine every applicant				
7	1.	for an operator's license. The examination must include a test of the applicant's				
, 8		eyesight; ability to read and understand highway signs regulating, warning, and				
0 9						
		directing traffic; and knowledge of the traffic laws of this state. The director shall make				
10		any written portion of the examination, except writing on illustrations of signs, available				
11		to an applicant in any widely practiced language. The director may waive the written				
12		portion of the examination for an applicant who has successfully passed a written				
13		examination in another state and has an operator's license that is not or in the process				
14		of being revoked, suspended, or canceled.				
15	2.	The director shall establish a process to administer the written portion of an				
16		examination for an operator's license through an online electronic medium. The				
17		director may not shall charge an applicant a fee of ten dollars to access the online				
18		written examination. The online examination must:				
19		a. Use personal questions about the applicant before the examination which the				
20		applicant is required to answer during the examination, to strengthen test security				
21		to deter fraud; and				
22		b. Require the applicant's parent or legal guardian to certify to the department the				
23		parent or legal guardian monitored the applicant during the online written				
24		examination, before issuance by the department of a class D instruction permit to				
25		an applicant who has passed the online examination.				
26	<u>3.</u>	The examination must include an actual demonstration of ability to exercise ordinary				
27		and reasonable control in the operation of a motor vehicle unless waived for an				
28		applicant who has successfully passed an actual ability test in this or another state				
29		conducted by a state licensing authority or by a commercial driver training school				
30		meeting the driver education requirements prescribed by the director under chapter				

- 39-25. A minor may operate a motor vehicle no matter how owned for the actual ability
 test.
- 3.4. In lieu of an eyesight test, the applicant may provide a statement of examination from
 a licensed physician or an optometrist stating the corrected and uncorrected vision of
 the applicant, if the examination was within six months of the application.
- 6 4.<u>5.</u> The director may require any other physical or mental examination.

7 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-06-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 **39-06**-

39-06-19. Expiration of license - Renewal.

- Every operator's license issued under this chapter or chapter 39-06.2 expires and is
 renewed according to this section.
- 12 2. The expiration date of a noncommercial operator's license for an individual whose 13 birth occurred in a year ending in an odd numeral is twelve midnight on the 14 anniversary of the birthday in the third subsequent year ending in an odd numeral. 15 except for an individual who, at the time of renewal, is seventy-eight years of age or 16 older is twelve midnight on the anniversary of the birthday in the second subsequent 17 year ending in an odd numeral. The expiration date of a noncommercial operator's 18 license for an individual whose birth occurred in a year ending in an even numeral is 19 twelve midnight on the anniversary of the birthday in the third subsequent year ending 20 in an even numeral, except for an individual who, at the time of renewal, is 21 seventy-eight years of age or older is twelve midnight on the anniversary of the 22 birthday in the second subsequent year ending in an even numeral.
- 3. The expiration date of a commercial operator's license for an individual whose birth
 occurred in a year ending in an odd numeral is twelve midnight on the anniversary of
 the birthday in the second subsequent year ending in an odd numeral. The expiration
 date of a commercial operator's license for an individual whose birth occurred in a
 year ending in an even numeral is twelve midnight on the anniversary of the birthday
 in the second subsequent year ending in an even numeral.
- An individual who has a valid, unexpired nonimmigrant visa or nonimmigrant visa
 status for entry into the United States, a pending application for asylum in the United
 States, a pending or approved application for temporary protected status in the United

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1 States, approved deferred action status, or a pending application for adjustment of 2 status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence or conditional 3 permanent residence status in the United States will be issued a temporary operator's 4 license or nondriver photo identification card. The temporary operator's license or 5 identification card is valid only during the period of time of the applicant's authorized 6 stay in the United States or, if there is no definite end to the period of authorized stay, 7 a period of one year. The license or card may be renewed only upon presentation of 8 valid documentary evidence that the status has been extended.

9 5. An applicant for renewal must present the application with the fee for renewal of 10 license to the director not before ten months prior to the expiration date of the 11 operator's license. The director may require an examination of an applicant as upon 12 an original application. The director may require an applicant for renewal or a 13 substitute to provide documentation that confirms to the satisfaction of the director the 14 true identity, date of birth, and legal presence of the applicant and provide a social 15 security card or other satisfactory evidence of a social security number and proof of 16 residence address, if not previously completed or if there are changes to the 17 information already on file. The director may not issue a distinguishing number that is, 18 contains, can be converted to, or is an encrypted version of the applicant's social 19 security number.

- 6. The director may not renew an operator's license if the license has been suspended
 under section 14-08.1-07. Upon the recommendation of the court, the director may
 issue a temporary permit to the licensee under section 39-06.1-11 if the temporary
 permit is necessary for the licensee to work and the court has determined the licensee
 is making a good-faith effort to comply with the child support order.
- An applicant for renewal of an operator's license must provide a certificate of
 examination from the driver licensing or examining authorities or a statement as to the
 corrected and uncorrected vision of the applicant from a licensed physician or an
 optometrist, except as required under subsection 9. The director shall provide visual
 examination equipment at each location where a license may be renewed.
