- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 <u>Century Code, relating to school district virtual learning policies; to amend and reenact sections</u>
- 3 15.1-06-04 and 15.1-27-23 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the satisfaction of
- 4 school calendar hours through virtual instruction; and to provide for a legislative management
- 5 <u>report</u>.

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#### 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 8 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 9 **15.1-06-04.** School calendar - Length.

- 10 1. A school district shall provide for a school calendar that includes:
- a. At least nine hundred sixty-two and one-half hours of instruction for elementary
  school students and one thousand fifty hours of instruction for middle and high
  school students;
- b. Three holidays, as selected by the board in consultation with district teachers
  from the list provided for in subdivisions b through j of subsection 1 of section
  15.1-06-02:

## 17 c. No more than two days for:

- (1) Parent-teacher conferences; or
- (2) Compensatory time for parent-teacher conferences held outside of regular school hours; and
- 21 d. At least three days of professional development not including meals or breaks.
- 22 2. For the first three days of professional development required under subdivision d of
  23 subsection 1, a day of professional development must consist of:

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1		a.	Six hours of professional development, exclusive of meals and other breaks,
2			conducted within a single day;
3		b.	Six hours of cumulative professional development conducted under the auspices
4			of a professional learning community; or
5		C.	Two four-hour periods of professional development, exclusive of meals and other
6			breaks, conducted over two days.
7	3.	lf be	ecause of weather or other conditions a school must cancel hours of instruction or
8		disn	niss before completing a full dayall hours of instruction for the day, the school is
9		resp	oonsible for making up only those hours and portions of an hour between the time
10		of <u>ca</u>	ancellation or early dismissal and the conclusion of a full dayall hours of classroom
11		instr	ruction for the day if the dismissal will result in the school failing to meet the
12		requ	uirements of subdivision a of subsection 1. except a school district may submit and
13		the s	superintendent of public instruction may approve an application to allow the school
14		<u>distr</u>	rict to offer instruction through a virtual education plan as provided under
15		sub:	section 6. A school district may satisfy the requirements of this section by providing
16		<u>virtu</u>	al instruction pursuant to section 2 of this Act.
17	4.	For	purposes of this section, a full day of instruction consists of:
18		a.	At least five and one-half hours for kindergarten and elementary students, during
19			which time the students are required to be in attendance for the purpose of
20			receiving curricular instruction; and
21		b.	At least six hours for high school students, during which time the students are
22			required to be in attendance for the purpose of receiving curricular instruction.
23	5.	lf a s	school district intends to operate under a school calendar that consists of four days
24		of in	nstruction per week, the school district shall apply and be approved for a waiver by
25		the	superintendent of public instruction.
26	<u> <u>6.    </u></u>	- <u>The</u>	superintendent of public instruction may adopt rules governing the submission,
27		<u>eva</u> l	luation, and approval of applications and the monitoring of any school district
28		rece	eiving a waiver under this subsection. To be eligible to receive a waiver under this
29		sub:	section, a school district must have virtual instruction available to all students and
30		<del>pro</del> √	vide evidence the school district's teachers and administration were actively
31		<u>instr</u>	ructing, facilitating, and engaging students through the virtual education plan on

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1		the days virtual instruction was offered. A virtual education plan must calculate		
2	instruction time by adding synchronous virtual instructional time, virtual meeting time,			
3	time a student is logged into the virtual learning platform, and time a student spends			
4	offline completing assignments as determined by the school. For purposes of this			
5	subsection, "synchronous" means occurring at a specific designated time.			
6	SEC	<b>CTION 2.</b> A new section to chapter 15.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
7	and enacted as follows:			
8	Sch	ool districts - Policy - Virtual learning - Report to legislative management.		
9	The	board of a school district or governing board of a nonpublic school that operates a		
10	physical school plant may adopt a policy to allow students to engage in virtual instruction and			
11	qualify f	or average daily membership in the district. The superintendent of public instruction		
12	shall ad	opt rules governing policies under this section. A policy adopted by a school district		
13	under th	is section must comply with the rules adopted by the superintendent of public		
14	instructi	on. The superintendent of public instruction shall provide biennial reports to the		
15	legislative management regarding the academic performance metrics of students participating
