- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 26.1-36-09.15 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to health insurance coverage of telehealth; and to declare an emergency for an
- 3 Act to provide for a legislative management study relating to coverage of telehealth.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 26.1-36-09.15 of the North Dakota Century Code is 6 amended and reenacted as follows: 7 26.1-36-09.15. Coverage of telehealth services. 8 As used in this section: 9 "Distant site" means a site at which a health care provider or health care facility is 10 located while providing medical services by means of telehealth. 11 "Health care facility" means any office or institution at which health services are 12 provided. The term includes hospitals; clinics; ambulatory surgery centers; 13 outpatient care facilities; nursing homes; nursing, basic, long-term, or assisted, 14 living, and residential facilities; group homes; laboratories; and offices of any 15 health care provider. 16 "Health care provider" includes an individual licensed under chapter 43-05, 17 43-06, 43-12.1 as a registered nurse or as an advanced practice registered 18 nurse, 43-13, 43-15, 43-17, 43-26.1, 43-28, 43-32, 43-37, 43-40, 43-41, 43-42, 19 43-44, 43-45, 43-47, 43-58, or 43-60. 20 "Originating site" means a site at which a patient is located at the time health-21 services are provided to the patient by means of telehealth. 22 "Policy" means an accident and health insurance policy, contract, or evidence of 23 coverage on a group, individual, blanket, franchise, or association basis.

1	f. "Store-and-forward technology" means electronic information, imaging, and
2	communication that is transferred, recorded, or otherwise stored in order to be-
3	reviewed at a distant site at a later date by a health care provider or health care
4	facility without the patient present in real time. The term includes telehomeremote
5	patient monitoring and interactive audio, video, and data communication.
6	<del>g. "Telehealth":</del>
7	(1) Means the use of interactive audio, video, or other telecommunications
8	technology that is used by a health care provider or health care facility at a
9	distant site to deliver health services at an originating site and that is
10	delivered over a secure connection that complies with the requirements of
11	state and federal laws.
12	(2) Includes the use of electronic media for consultation relating to the health
13	care diagnosis or treatment of a patient in real time or through the use of
14	store-and-forward technology.
15	(3) Includes audio-only telephone if no other means of communications
16	technology are available to the patient, including lack of adequate
17	broadband access, or that other means of communications technology
18	being infeasible, impractical, or otherwise not medically advisable, as
19	determined by the health care provider or health care facility providing
20	telehealth services to the patient or as determined by another health care
21	provider or health care facility with an existing relationship with the patient.
22	(4) Does not include the use of audio-only telephone, electronic mail, or
23	facsimile transmissions.
24	2. An insurer may not deliver, issue, execute, or renew a policy that provides health
25	benefits coverage unless that policy provides coverage for health services delivered
26	by means of telehealth which is the same as the coverage for health services-
27	delivered by in-person means.
28	3. Payment or reimbursement of expenses for covered health services delivered by
29	means of telehealth under this section may not be established through negotiations
30	conducted by the insurer with the health services providers in the same manner as the
31	insurer with the health services providers in the same manner as the insurer

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - TELEHEALTH COVERAGE. During
the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall study telehealth costs, services, and
reimbursement options. The study should include input from stakeholders, such as providers,
payors, and the insurance department. A goal of the study is to encourage providers and payors
to collaborate to find a mutually agreeable telehealth reimbursement structure. The study may
begin with a focus on behavioral health provided via telehealth. The legislative management
shall report its finding and recommendations, together with any legislation required to
implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly.
