- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 6-09.4, a new section to chapter
- 2 15-10, a new section to chapter 15-20.1, a new section to chapter 15.1-02, a new section to
- 3 chapter 21-10, a new section to chapter 54-27, and a new section to chapter 54-34.3 of the
- 4 North Dakota Century Code, relating to an infrastructure bonding repayment fund, a research
- 5 and innovation fund, a workforce development and lifelong education fund, a student meal and
- 6 support services fund, a legacy earnings fund, a human services and public health stabilization
- 7 fund, and a regional economic development infrastructure fund; to amend and reenact
- 8 subsection 1 of section 21-10-06, section 21-10-12, and sections 54-54-08.1 and 54-54-08.2 of
- 9 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to funds invested by the state investment board.
- 10 legacy fund definitions, and an arts and culture endowment fund; to provide a continuing
- 11 appropriation; and to provide a transfer.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 13 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 6-09.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 14 and enacted as follows:
- 15 <u>Infrastructure bonding repayment fund - Debt service requirements - Public finance</u> 16
- authority.
- 17 There is created in the state treasury the infrastructure bonding repayment fund. The fund
- 18 consists of all moneys deposited in the fund under section 7 of this Act. Moneys in the fund may
- 19 be spent by the public finance authority pursuant to legislative appropriations to meet the debt
- 20 service requirements for evidences of indebtedness issued by the authority to support
- 21 infrastructure bonding. Each biennium, the authority shall request from the legislative assembly
- 22 an appropriation from the infrastructure bonding repayment fund or other sources to meet the
- 23 debt service requirements.

10	of life for North Dakota residents, for research projects to diversify the state's economy, and for					
11	collaborative curriculum development to support the growth of established and new industries.					
12	The grant funding must be available to all institutions under the control of the board and tribally					
13	controlled community colleges.

22		early childhood education, and after school programs;				
23	<u>2.</u>	The development and operation of a paid family leave program;				
24	<u>3.</u>	Skills development and job retraining programs:				
25	<u>4.</u>	The development or enhancement of certificate, associate degree, and bachelor's				
26		degree programs delivered through elementary, secondary, and postsecondary				
27		education for occupations in high demand, for adult education programs, and for				
28		instructional programs related to English language learners; and				
29	<u>5.</u>	The development of collaborative systems shared by state agencies to increase				
30		retention and the completion of high school diplomas, certificate programs, associate

6	Ther	There is created in the state treasury the student meal and support services fund. The fund						
7	consists	consists of all moneys deposited in the fund under section 7 of this Act. Moneys in the fund may						
8	be spent	be spent by the superintendent of public instruction pursuant to legislative appropriations to						
9	provide grant assistance for student meal programs and student support services. The							
10	superintendent shall develop guidelines for the grants, including eligibility criteria and reporting							
11	requirements. The grant funding must be used to pay for costs associated with student meal							
12	programs, to reimburse school districts for unpaid student lunch debt, and to provide funding for							
13	student support services, including programs for students who have individualized education							
14	plans, pro	ogra	ms related to English language learners, and behavioral health services. The grant					
15	funding p	rovi	ded for student meal programs and reimbursements for unpaid student lunch debt					
16	must be prioritized for students eligible for free and reduced lunch programs.

1		fund assets as reported by the state investment board. The average value of the					
2		legacy fund assets must be calculated using the value of the assets at the end of each					
3		fiscal year for the five-year period ending with the most recently completed even-					
4		numbered fiscal year.					
5	<u>5.</u>	On July first of each odd-numbered year, from the amount available for appropriation					
6		or transfer from the legacy earnings fund for the biennium, the state treasurer shall					
7		trar	transfer funding as follows:				
8		<u>a.</u>	Twenty-five percent to the infrastructure bonding repayment fund under section 1				
9			of this Act:				
10		<u>b.</u>	Fifteen percent to the research and innovation fund under section 2 of this Act;

12			section 8 of this Act, but not in an amount that would bring the balance in the fund

27	There is created in the state treasury the human services and public health stabilization						
28	fund. The fund consists of all moneys deposited in the fund under section 7 of this Act and all						
29	interest and earnings upon moneys in the fund. The state investment board shall supervise						
30	investment of the fund in accordance with chapter 21-10. Upon order of the governor, moneys						
31	in the fu	in the fund are appropriated to and may be spent by the department of human services and					

- state department of health only to offset general fund budget allotments made during a
 biennium under section 54-44.1-12 due to a revenue shortfall. Whenever the balance of the
- 3 <u>fund exceeds fifteen percent of the combined general fund appropriations for the department of</u>
- 4 <u>human services and the state department of health for the most recently completed biennium,</u>
- 5 as determined by the office of management and budget, the legislative assembly may
- 6 appropriate or transfer any excess amounts for human services-related and health-related
- 7 purposes.

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8 **SECTION 9.** A new section to chapter 54-34.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 9 and enacted as follows:

10 Regional economic development infrastructure fund - Revolving loans - Bank of 11 North Dakota - Continuing appropriation.

- 1. There is created in the state treasury the regional economic development infrastructure fund. The fund consists of all moneys deposited in the fund under section 7 of this Act. Moneys in the fund may be spent by the department of commerce pursuant to legislative appropriations to provide grants or loans to support the following:
 - <u>a.</u> The development of broadband internet delivery to every community in the state;
 - b. The development of infrastructure to deliver energy to communities for the purpose of economic and community expansion and diversification;
 - <u>c.</u> The development of value-added agriculture projects, products, and services;
 <u>and</u>
 - d. Local and regional tourism infrastructure projects.
- 2. The department of commerce shall develop guidelines for the grants, including eligibility criteria and reporting requirements. The department of commerce may designate moneys in the fund for loans under this section. At least fifty percent of the funding deposited in the fund must be available for rural communities and communities located within the exterior boundaries of an Indian reservation.
 - 3. Moneys in the fund designated for loans are appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota on a continuing basis for the purpose of loan disbursements and administrative costs.
 The Bank shall develop policies for the loans in consultation with the department of commerce. The Bank shall review loan applications. To be eligible for a loan under this

1 section, an entity shall agree to provide the Bank with information as requested. The 2 Bank may develop policies for loan participation with local financial institutions. The 3 Bank shall deposit in the fund all principal and interest paid on the loans made from 4 the fund. The Bank may use a portion of the interest paid on the outstanding loans as 5 a servicing fee to pay for administrative costs. The Bank shall contract with a certified 6 public accounting firm to audit the fund if the fund has any outstanding loans. The cost 7 of the audit must be paid from the fund. 8 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 54-54-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows: 10 54-54-08.1. Cultural Arts and culture endowment fund - Purposes. 11 The North Dakota culturalarts and culture endowment fund is hereby established to improve 12 the intrinsic quality of the lives of the state's citizens now and in the future through programs 13 approved by the council on the arts. Such programs must: 14 Increase cultural awareness by the state's citizens through programs in arts, crafts, 15 theater, ethnic and folk arts, literature, journalism, public media, historic preservation 16 and interpretation, visual arts, and architecture. 17 2. Make the items named in subsection 1 more available to the state's citizens. 18 3. Encourage the development of talent in the areas named in subsection 1 within the 19 state. 20 Preserve and increase understanding of North Dakota's heritage and future. 21 SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 54-54-08.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 amended and reenacted as follows: 23 54-54-08.2. Cultural endowments - Limitations. 24 Investment of the culturalarts and culture endowment fund must be under the supervision of 25 the state investment board in accordance with chapter 21-10. Funds will be expended from the-26 cultural endowment fund only to the limits of accrued interest on state general fund-27 appropriations and other public and private funds received. The expenditure of endowment 28 funds must occur at the direction of Interest and earnings upon moneys in the fund may be 29 spent by the North Dakota council on the arts pursuant to legislative appropriations to provide 30 grants to support the delivery of arts programing, cultural education and exploration, and the 31 purposes under section 54-08.1. The North Dakota council on the arts shall award the grants in

- 1 consultation with prairie public broadcasting, the North Dakota humanities council, the Indian
- 2 <u>affairs commission, the state historical society, and the North Dakota studies program</u>. The
- 3 council may seek the counsel and assistance of a group or groups of private citizens of the
- 4 council's choosing to aid it in arriving at expenditure decisions when private funds are involved.
- 5 Section 54-54-06 applies to private donations to the cultural endowment fund; provided, that
- 6 gifts, donations, and bequests can be dedicated as principal of the fund in perpetuity or for a
- 7 term of years, in which case only the income earned as a result of investment of those funds
- 8 can be expended pursuant to section 54-54-08.1 and this section.
