5 6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 26 of section 4.1-40-01 of the North Dakota 7 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 8 26. "Specialty fertilizer" means a fertilizer distributed primarily for nonfarm use, 9 including use on home gardens, lawns, shrubbery, flowers, golf courses, municipal 10 parks, cemeteries, greenhouses, and nurseries. 11 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 4.1-40-03 of the North Dakota Century 12 Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 13 7. The requirements of this section do not apply to persons that distribute only: 14 a. Specialty fertilizers to end users; or 15 Seed inoculants. b. 16 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 4.1-40-06 of the North Dakota Century 17 Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 18 If the product is in a container, the label must be plainly printed in English and 19 conspicuously placed on or attached to the container. The label must include: 20 a. The net weight of the product; 21 b. The brand;
