- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to a student teacher scholarship program; and to provide an
- 3 appropriation.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Student teacher scholarship program - Administered by the board.

- For purposes of this section:
 - "Remote school district" has the same meaning as the term is defined in the 2006 a. national center for education statistics locale codes.
 - "Rural school district" has the same meaning as the term is defined in the 2006 national center for education statistics locale codes.
 - b.c. "Student teacher" means an individual enrolled at an institution under the controlof the state board of higher education, a private institution of higher education located in this state, or a tribal college located in this state in a state-approved educator preparation program in this state who is completing an education degreethe qualifications to become a licensed teacher, and who has signed a contract to teach at a rural school district under the supervision of a licensed teacher.
- <u>2.</u> The state board of higher education shall administer a student teacher scholarship program. The board shall adopt rules to administer the program including rules establishing an application process, eligibility criteria, and distribution of program scholarships. An eligible student teacher may apply to the board to receive a scholarship under the program.

5	SEC	TION 2. A	APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general				
6	fund in t	he state tr	easury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,000,000\subseteq500,000, or so				
7	much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state board of higher education for the purpose of						
8	providing scholarships to eligible student teachers under the student teacher scholarship						
9	program, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023. A school district						
10	shall pro	vide one o	dollar of matching funds for each one dollar from the general fund for student				
11	teachers	s hired und	der this Act.
