## **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2242**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 51-07 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the sale or purchase of a catalytic converter; and to provide a penalty.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 51-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

5 and enacted as follows:

## 6 Sale or purchase of catalytic converter.

- 7 <u>1.</u> As used in this section, "core recycler" means a person that buys used individual
- 8 <u>catalytic converters previously removed from a motor vehicle. The term includes a</u>
- 9 recycler, junk dealer, valuable metal dealer, pawn shop, and a chop shop as defined in
  10 section 39-30-01.
- 12 <u>A core recycler may not purchase or attempt to purchase a catalytic converter, in</u>
- 12 whole or in part, when the catalytic converter is not attached to a motor vehicle at the
- 13 time of the sale or attempted sale, unless the seller is a used parts dealer or an
- 14 <u>automotive repair company.</u>
- 15 <u>3.</u> <u>Subsection 2 does not apply if the seller:</u>
- 16a.Provides the core recycler with a certificate of title, certificate of registration, a17receipt from a transaction of repair, or a bill of sale for the motor vehicle from18which the catalytic converter was taken; or
- 19b.Is a licensed business that in the regular course of business collects, stores, or20sells a catalytic converter or any other motor vehicle part.
- 21 <u>4.</u> <u>A person that violates this section is subject to a fine of one thousand dollars for a first</u>
- 22 offense, and a fine of two thousand dollars for a subsequent offense. In addition to the
- 23 <u>fine imposed for a subsequent offense, the court shall order the defendant to cease</u>
- 24 <u>engaging in the business of a core recycler for a period one year.</u>
