- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 39-05-20.5 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to a certificate of collector's title; and to provide a penalty.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** Section 39-05-20.5 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted

5 as follows:

6 <u>39-05-20.5. Certificate of collector's title - Penalty.</u>

- 7 <u>1.</u> Notwithstanding sections 39-05-20 through 39-05-20.4, the department may issue a
- 8 <u>certificate of collector's title to an owner of a rebuilt, reconstructed, salvaged, antique,</u>
- 9 <u>or vintage motor vehicle upon application and satisfactory proof of ownership, without</u>
 10 <u>a certificate of inspection.</u>
- 11 <u>2.</u> <u>The department may establish procedures for determining satisfactory proof of</u>
- 12 <u>ownership of a motor vehicle in those cases in which the department is unable to</u>
- 13 determine the legal owner of record. Any person aggrieved by a decision of the
- 14 <u>department as to ownership of a motor vehicle may appeal that decision to the district</u>
 15 <u>court under chapter 28-32.</u>
- 16 <u>3.</u> The applicant for a certificate of collector's title shall include with the application a ten
 17 <u>dollar fee for the certificate.</u>
- 18 <u>4.</u> <u>A certificate of collector's title authorizes the owner of the motor vehicle to reconstruct,</u>
- 19 rebuild, and sell the motor vehicle. An owner issued a certificate of collector's title may
- 20 <u>not operate the motor vehicle on any highway, street, or road. A violation of this</u>
- 21 <u>subsection is a class A misdemeanor.</u>
- 22 <u>5.</u> <u>The department may not issue a certificate of collector's title if:</u>
- 23 <u>a.</u> <u>The application contains any false or fraudulent statements;</u>

1	<u>b.</u>	The applicant has failed to furnish required information or reasonable additional
2		information requested by the department;
3	<u>C.</u>	The department has reason to believe the vehicle is a stolen or embezzled
4		vehicle or the granting of title would constitute a fraud against the rightful owner
5		or other person having valid lien upon the vehicle;
6	<u>d.</u>	The certificate of title is suspended or revoked for any reason;
7	<u>e.</u>	The required fee has not been paid; or
8	<u>f.</u>	Any sales tax or motor vehicle excise tax, properly due, has not been paid.
