SB 2271: A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 16.1-14-29 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to withholding vote totals for presidential elections; to amend and reenact sections 16.1-14-01 and 16.1-14-27 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to procedures for canvassing and counting votes for presidential electors; to provide a penalty; and to provide a contingent effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.
