

### **Bed Occupancy For Nursing Home Facilities**




### **Nursing Facility Medicaid Occupancy**

# **Basic Care Facilities**

# Basic Care Payment Two Components

### **Personal Care Rate**

- Medicaid funded
- For ADL and IADL assist
- Salaries and fringe benefits only
- Must be provide for at least 15 minutes per day
- No bed hold payment

### **Room and Board Rate**

- State Funded
- Supplies and Property costs
- Allocated costs for nonhands-on care
- Bed hold payment applicable


### **Olmstead Decision**

- The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires public agencies to eliminate unnecessary segregation of persons with disabilities and provide services in the most integrated setting appropriate to the needs of the individual.
- In 1999 the Federal Supreme Court Olmstead decision affirmed the ADA requirements.
- Increasing access to HCBS will assist the State in meeting this requirement.

### **Benefits of HCBS**


- Most integrated setting means, a setting where individuals with disabilities can fully interact with individuals with non-disabilities and take advantage of community living as much as possible.
  - Usually, a private residence owned or leased by the individual or their family.
- Most integrated setting for each individual is determined through person centered planning and informed choice.



### **Funding Requests**

### **Nursing Home Payment Reform**

- Reform of both care and property rate methodology
- Interim report submitted October 1, 2020
- Policy testimony will be presented in **Human Services Committee**
- DHS sponsored bill- House Bill 1090
- \$7.2 million (\$3.3m General; \$3.8m Federal)

### **Nursing Home Bed Buy Back**

- Request to purchase beds out of the current nursing home system and layaway
- State plans to pay between \$12,000-\$15,000 per bed
- Taking beds out of the system reduces future State liability
- \$3.3m in General Funds

- Autism Voucher = \$1.358 million general fund savings by eliminating
- Autism Waiver = \$830,000 increase in general funds for increase
   of 54 slots and state plan services
- Autism Training funds = \$93,000 in general fund savings by eliminating


