- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-21-02.6 and <u>15.1-21-02.7</u>15.1-21-02.8 of
- 2 the North Dakota Century Code, relating to resident student eligibility to receive
- 3 bothrequirements for the North Dakota academic and career and technical education
- 4 scholarships.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is

8	shall provide notification to the student within ten days.
9	c. A student is not entitled to receive more than six thousand dollars under this

11	d. The state board of higher education shall forward the scholarship directly to the
12	institution in which the student is enrolled.

24	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.8 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
25	amended and reenacted as follows:

27	1. a. Notwithstanding section 15.1-21-02.6, if a student's cumulative grade point		
28	average as determined by the state board of higher education at the conclusion		
29	of a semester is below 2.75, the board shall grant an exception and provide the		
30	North Dakota scholarship to which the student would otherwise be entitled for the		

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1			next semester in which the student is enrolled full timeat least half time. The
2			exception provided by this section is applicable to a student only one time.
3		b.	If a student's cumulative grade point average as determined by the state board of
4			higher education at the conclusion of a semester is below 2.75 for a second time,
5			the student is no longer eligible to receive any additional North Dakota academic
6			or career and technical education scholarships.
7	2.	a.	Notwithstanding section 15.1-21-02.6, if a student's cumulative grade point
8			average as determined by the state board of higher education at the conclusion
9			of a quarter is below 2.75, the board shall grant an exception and provide the
10			North Dakota scholarship to which the student would otherwise be entitled for the
11			next quarter in which the student is enrolled full timeat least half time. The
12			exception provided by this section is applicable to a student only one time.
13		b.	If a student's cumulative grade point average as determined by the state board of
14			higher education at the conclusion of a quarter is below 2.75 for a second time,
15			the student is no longer eligible to receive any additional North Dakota academic
16			or career and technical education scholarships.
