I support HB 1377

This bill gives the freedom to decline a required vaccine as a condition of employment, school attendance, or licensure if the following is not met:

- The pivotal clinical trial the United States Food and Drug Administration relied upon to approve the vaccine evaluated the safety of the vaccine for at least one year after the vaccine was administered against a control group that received either a placebo or another vaccine that meets this criteria.
- The state department of health posts on the department's website the injuries or diseases <u>caused</u> by the vaccine and the <u>rate at which the injury</u> <u>or disease occurs from the vaccine</u>.
- The risk of <u>permanent disability or death</u> from the vaccine has been proven to be less than that caused by the infection the vaccine is intended to prevent.
- The <u>vaccine's manufacturer has liability</u>, including for design defect claims, for any death or injury caused by the vaccine.

I like HB 1377 because it mandates <u>full disclosure</u> so one can make an informed decision.
