My name is Melyssa Howry, and I am a resident of New Town, North Dakota. I am testifying in support of this bill. Over the past 9 months, we have seen masks become a fixture in society. However the science still remains unsettled as to whether or not masks prevent the spread of viruses of any kind. In fact, much of the data I have read seems to point to the possibility of masks actually causing an increase in contamination and the spread of Covid-19. We know that masks can increase the risk of bacterial infections, and that they are a breeding ground for more viruses and bacteria to cause additional problems. For these reasons alone, masks should not be required in the workplace, especially non-healthcare settings.
