



**Testimony of Dr. Andrea Grondahl

Chairman Luick and members of the Senate Agriculture Committee, I am Dr. Andrea Grondahl, Livestock Industries Director for the North Dakota Department of Agriculture (NDDA), and I am representing Agriculture Commissioner Doug Goehring. I am here today in support of Senate Bill 2050, which would adopt the most current federal meat inspections regulations.

The Federal Meat Inspection Act (FMIA) allows states to operate their own meat inspection program, provided the State develops and maintains laws, regulations, and procedures that are “at least equal to” the federal program operated by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). The most effective way to meet “equal to” regulation requirements is to adopt the most recent version of federal regulations related to meat inspection. We are here today to update the statute to the most current federal regulations through Senate Bill 2050. There are no new regulations being incorporated.
