

1 HB 1337 – NDCEL Testimony in Support

Copas serving as the Executive Director for NDCEL.

What is presented in this bill is a good thing for a community that is struggling in population to 4 the point of the school being ready to close. I've been there – as a superintendent in South Dakota, 5 6 our school did close due to declining population. That is one of the most difficult things that a 7 community experiences. It is devastating. In South Dakota, there is exists a law that is very similar 8 to what is described here which enabled that school to sell to the city the building for \$1, keep the 9 lights on, and the town was able to convert that building into a better community center for the 10 folks living there and even turned the classrooms into little opportunities for patrons to utilize them 11 for various things. One classroom was a thrift store, others were offered as office space to people 12 attempting to start small businesses. It was a blessing to the community – to those tax payers who had made that building possible to begin with. 13

14 This bill is providing the opportunity for a community to either keep a building such as this a part 15 of their communities and utilize it, or to do whatever they think they might need to.
