- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide appropriations to the department of health and human services for a
- 2 developmental disability provider payment rate review and for adjustments to developmental
- 3 disability provider payment rates.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES 6 DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY PROVIDER RATE REVIEW. There is appropriated out of any
- 7 moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of
- 8 \$300,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, and from other funds derived from
- 9 federal funds, the sum of \$300,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the
- department of health and human services for the purpose of conducting a review of payment
- 11 rates for intermediate care facilities and residential habilitation service providers, for the
- 12 biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.
- 13 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES -
- 14 **DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY PROVIDER RATE ADJUSTMENTS.** There is appropriated
- out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum
- of \$11,014,930, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, and from other funds derived from
- 17 federal funds, the sum of \$11,464,520, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the
- department of health and human services for the purpose of providing rate adjustments for
- 19 developmental disability providers, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
- June 30, 2027. The department of health and human services shall adjust rates based on the
- 21 payment rate review conducted under section 1 of this Act. Adjustments resulting from the rate
- 22 review must become effective on July 1, 2026, and may not exceed 10.3 percent for
- 23 intermediate care facilities and may not exceed 8.4 percent for residential habilitation services.
