

**FIRST ENGROSSMENT
with House Amendments
ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2018**

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state historical
2 society; to amend and reenact sections 55-03-01 and 55-03-01.1 of the North Dakota Century
3 Code, relating to permit fees; to provide an exemption; and to provide for a legislative
4 management study.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
7 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
8 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
9 other income, to the state historical society for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
10 state historical society, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025, as
11 follows:

1 **SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO THE**
2 **SIXTY-NINTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The following amounts reflect the one-time funding
3 items approved by the sixty-seventh legislative assembly for the 2021-23 biennium and the
4 2023-25 biennium one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

25 The 2023-25 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget
26 for the 2025-27 biennium. The state historical society shall report to the appropriations
27 committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the
28 biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.

29 **SECTION 3. REVOLVING FUND - APPROPRIATION.** All fees collected by the state
30 historical society and deposited in the revolving fund established pursuant to section 55-03-04

1 are appropriated to the state historical society for the purposes provided in chapter 55-03, for
2 the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.

3 **SECTION 4. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND BEQUESTS - APPROPRIATION.** All gifts, grants,
4 devises, bequests, donations, and assignments received by the state historical society and
5 deposited with the state treasurer pursuant to section 55-01-04 are appropriated to the state
6 historical society for the purposes provided in section 55-01-04, for the biennium beginning
7 July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.

8 **SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS**
9 **FUND - STATE HISTORICAL SOCIETY.** The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act
10 includes \$2,800,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund, of which \$2,500,000
11 is for critical repairs to historic site structures and \$300,000 is for creating new and repairing
12 existing exhibits.

13 **SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION GRANT.**
14 The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$100,000 of grant funding from
15 the department of transportation for the purpose of defraying expenses of the Lewis and Clark
16 interpretive center.

17 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 55-03-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
18 amended and reenacted as follows:

19 **55-03-01. Permit required to investigate, evaluate, or mitigate adverse effect on**
20 **cultural resources, historic buildings, structures, or objects - Application - Fee.**

21 Any person engaged in identifying, evaluating, or mitigating adverse effects on cultural
22 resources, historic buildings, structures, or objects on any lands in North Dakota, under
23 ~~section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 [Pub. L. 89-665; 80 Stat. 915;~~
24 ~~16 U.S.C. 470, as amended by Pub. L. 91-243, Pub. L. 93-54, Pub. L. 94-422, and Pub. L.~~
25 ~~94-458], 36 CFR 800, or subdivision u of subsection 1 of section 38-14.1-14~~ any applicable state
26 law, shall obtain an annual permit from the director of the state historical society. The permit
27 application must be in the form prescribed by the director. Each application must be
28 accompanied by a filing fee ~~of one hundred dollars~~ as determined by the director. The director
29 may waive the fee requirement if the applicant is an instrumentality of the state. Following
30 issuance of the annual permit, the permittee shall submit to the state historical society payment
31 in the amount ~~of fifty dollars~~ determined by the director with every cultural resources

1 identification, monitoring report, evaluation, and mitigation report submitted to the director in
2 compliance with the federal and state statutory and regulatory requirements identified in this
3 section. A permittee submitting a report on behalf of a nonprofit corporation formed under
4 chapter 10-33 does not have to pay the fee for filing the report.

5 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 55-03-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **55-03-01.1. Permit required to investigate, excavate, or otherwise record cultural**
8 **resources on land owned by an instrumentality of the state and to excavate cultural**
9 **resources on private land.**

10 Any person engaged in the investigation, excavation, or other recording of cultural
11 resources on land owned by an instrumentality of the state or in the excavation of cultural
12 resources on private land for any purposes other than those identified in section 55-03-01 first
13 shall obtain a permit from the director. A permit may be granted only for the investigation,
14 excavation, or other recording of cultural resources at the locations described in the application
15 for permit. Each application must be accompanied by a fee of ~~one hundred dollars~~ as
16 determined by the director, unless the director waives the fee.

17 **SECTION 9. EXEMPTION - FEDERAL STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND.** Section
18 54-44.1-11 does not apply to the appropriation in section 5 of chapter 18 of the 2021 Session
19 Laws as amended by section 2 of chapter 548 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws, and
20 any unexpended funds from this appropriation may be continued and used for the purpose of
21 deferred maintenance and extraordinary repair projects during the biennium beginning July 1,
22 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.

23 **SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - RECORDS RETENTION.** During
24 the 2023-24 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the records
25 management programs of state agencies and institutions related to records deemed historic in
26 value. The study must include a review of state agencies' and institutions' compliance with the
27 records management programs. The legislative management shall report its findings and
28 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
29 the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.
