6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

10 **SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - FIREARM AND DANGEROUS**
11 **WEAPONS RESTRICTIONS.** During the 2023-24 interim, the legislative management shall
12 study those provisions of the North Dakota Century Code that place restrictions on carrying
13 firearms and dangerous weapons. The study may include an examination of the state's current
14 firearm and weapon possession prohibitions as compared to the nation's historical regulations
15 and restrictions on the time, place, and manner in which firearms and dangerous weapons may
16 be possessed. The study must include: an assessment of recent federal court cases relating to
17 firearm restrictions, including public carry; and an examination of the definition of a dangerous
18 weapon and whether the current definition of a dangerous weapon should be maintained,
19 narrowed, or expanded. The study must include input from the attorney general, the tax
20 commissioner, the superintendent of public instruction, the supreme court, the association of
21 counties, the league of cities, the state's attorney association, the association of criminal
22 defense lawyers, and the peace officers association. The legislative management shall report its
23 findings and recommendations, together with any legislation necessary to implement the
24 recommendations, to the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.
