Sixty-eighth Legislative Assembly

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Bismarck, March 6, 2023

The House convened at 1:00 p.m., with Speaker D. Johnson presiding.

The prayer was offered by Sister Kathleen Atkinson, OSB Director, Ministry on the Margins, Bismarck.

REP. WARREY rose on a point of personal privilege.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE WARREY

MR. SPEAKER: Central Cass Lady Squirrels accomplished an unprecedented event this weekend by winning two consecutive overtime games to capture the ND Class B state girls basketball championship. It's the first basketball title of any kind for Central Cass since 1968 when Central Cass thumped a Wolford team. I only say that since a representative from District 14 (who may just be sitting behind me) was on that team.

The Lady Squirrels defeated Bowman County and Rugby to set up a matchup with Thompson in the championship game. The Lady Squirrels overcame a banked in three pointer at the end of regulation that tied the game--to capture the state title in a thrilling 58-55 OT finish. The new three class system kicks in next year so this will be the last year of Central Cass participating in the State B.

Squirrel Phenom Deontee Smith walked away with Tournament MVP honors by scoring 78 points and grabbing 34 rebounds. Deontee will resume her career at Northern State University in Aberdeen. The ND House of Representatives congratulates the Central Cass Squirrels on this terrific accomplishment!
