SB 2350: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 11-10, a new section to chapter 40-05, and a new section to chapter 58-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to traffic signs.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

Sens. Kreun, Burckhard, Elkin, Rummel and Reps. O'Brien, Schreiber-Beck introduced:

SB 2351: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a data collection system for classroom and hallway clearings.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.

Sens. Hogue, Klein, K. Roers and Reps. Bosch, Lefor, Schauer introduced:

SB 2352: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 16.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to liability of officers and executive committee members of a political organization.

Was read the first time and referred to the State and Local Government Committee.

Sen. Mathern and Rep. Brandenburg introduced:

SB 2353: A BILL for an Act to provide for a needs assessment; and to provide for a report. Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture and Veterans Affairs Committee.
