REMARKS OF SENATOR BARTA

MADAM PRESIDENT: This past Saturday, March 11, 2023, the Grand Forks Red River Roughrider girls' basketball team won the program's first state championship in 35 years when they defeated Bismarck Century in the final game of the Class A girls basketball season. It had been 31 years since a girls' basketball team from Red River had reached a title game, and this group was not going to be denied a championship.

The adage that defense wins championships was certainly the case in the Roughriders title run. Red River put together their 3 best defensive efforts of the year in running the table at the State tournament. In each of their three tournament victories, Red River's unrelenting defense held each of their high scoring opponents to season lows in scoring. The Roughriders Tenacious D was locked in throughout their 25-2 season as they only allowed an average of 37 points per game. This was all accomplished with a roster of athletes that, by most basketball standards, would be called undersized. With only one player over 5'10", it was speed, quickness, desire and downright grit, that lead the Riders to the top of Class A girls' basketball this year. This team's mantra throughout the season has been "heart over height" and that certainly held true last weekend.

The Roughriders were led by junior Jocelyn Schiller, who was named the Tournament's Most Valuable Player. Schiller set two championship game scoring records on Saturday. Not only were her 34 total points a title game record, "Schill the Thrill" also set a title game record by making 18 free throws. An interesting sidenote to this record is that the previous title game

scoring record, set in 1984, was held by Dorene Heisler of Devils Lake; a classmate of current Red River Coach Kent Ripplinger.

In addition to being the tourney MVP, Schiller and senior Cassidy O'Halloran were named to the all-tournament team. O'Halloran is a Red River legacy as her mother was a member of the 1988 Class A state championship team.

This story gets even better: Every member of this roster holds a 4.0 grade-point average. So not only are they champions on the court, but they are also champions in the classroom.

Congratulations to your 2023 Class A Girls' Basketball State Champions, the Grand Forks Red River Roughriders!

North Dakota, please take note, Grand Forks Red River is not just a hockey school.
