The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Miller presiding.

The prayer was offered by Senator Bob Paulson, District 3, Minot.

The roll was called and all members were present.

A quorum was declared by the President.

POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

SEN. WEBER rose on a point of personal privilege.

REMARKS OF SENATOR WEBER

MADAM PRESIDENT: Thank you, Madam President. I'd like to stand up today and congratulate the Central Cass boys' basketball team for winning the state championship.

Just a little history, back in 1955 they won their first title when they defeated Sherwood High School. In 1968 they also won the title by defeating the Woldford Wolves. That was in 1968, I was in the fifth grade, and I remember listening to it on the radio.

They've been to the state tournament several times: 1991, 1997, 2005 and 2012 and my colleague Representative Jonathan Warrey, serving the House from District 22, was a member of the 1991 team.

So coming into the state tournament, Central Cass was undefeated, they had a 23-0 record and were ranked first in the state. They defeated a scrappy Warwick team before pulling away to win 58-46. In the semifinals they beat Des Lacs Burlington to get to the final.

Before I mention the title game, I want to say a few things about Shiloh Christian. They were an excellent team and ranked fourth in the state. Coming into the tournament they beat Powers Lake Burke Central in the first round and Beulah in the second round. They had to go into overtime. It was a thrilling overtime to get to the finals. Most of you know that the Senator from District 47 served as their head coach for many years. He guided them to eleven state appearances. So, he helped lay the groundwork for their success. In fact, we made a little friendly wager on the game that whoever would win the other one would get the other team's cap. I did give him a Central Cass cap and I am sure he will wear it proudly.

You may not know that on Saturday night at the tournament, the young lady who sang the National Anthem was Miss Ella Strut and Ella is the granddaughter of the Senator from District 30. It was very nice. She did a beautiful job.

Both Shiloh Christian and Central Cass were excellent and well-deserving teams, but of course only one team can win. Throughout the game it was tight the whole way before Central Cass pulled away in the final minutes to win 61-44 over Shiloh Christian.

Throughout the season the Central Cass Squirrels played a full court pressure defense, keeping opponents off balance. Their quick, scrappy and aggressive style were unmatched. Besides their excellent passing ability, they had a fleet of long-range bombers who could hit the three pointers seemingly at will. And with their outstanding teamwork and unselfish play, they had balanced scoring throughout the year. Any one night a different person would lead the scoring. They also had a very strong bench and they played as much as the starters, and they obviously had team chemistry. Sam Kobbervig, one of the star guards was named one of the tournament MVPs.

Central Cass is only the second school in class B history to win both the boys' and girls' state championships in basketball. The other team to do this was Bishop Ryan from the Magic City in the 1993-94 session.

The state class B basketball tournament, as we have traditionally known for many years now will change, as we move into a three-class system. It closes a chapter of history for class B basketball. I am extremely honored to have the privilege of congratulating both the boys' and girls' basketball teams for winning their titles in this, their final year of class B as we know it.
