**3 - Bill and Fiscal Impact Summary**

This bill would allow us to admit some veterans that previously were not eligible. Hard to determine the direct fiscal impact as it would depend upon whether they were skilled nursing home residents or basic care residents, revenue vary significantly. Expenses also vary.

This section of the bill would allow some veterans who were previously not eligible for admission into the home to become eligible, "who were discharged or released under other than dishonorable conditions and who do not meet the definition of a veteran but who are or may become permanently disabled from any cause while in line and discharge of duty., and who are enrolled in veterans' affairs health care before admission to the veterans' home".

Fiscal impact is difficult. We collect rents from residents, however, they vary greatly depending upon whether they are skilled or basic. Basic care rent is dependent upon income and can vary from \$0 - \$2010 per month. Skilled care rent can vary from \$9,184 - \$15,300 per month. We also collect a daily per diem from the Department of Veterans Affairs for each day that a resident is in the facility, this rate is currently \$45 for basic care and \$112 for skilled care.

Expenses would vary depending upon the resident. The costs for upkeep of the resident's room, care etc. would be immaterial as we would have the same amount of staff and expenses for upkeep of the building. The biggest impact to the expenses would be dependent upon each individual's medications and whether they have health insurance or not as we are required to provide their medications and primary care costs. In the fiscal impact above I assumed we would have 1 basic care and 1 skilled care admit.
