


Biennium Challenges



This was evidenced by our visitation counts growing 164% from 2020 to 2022. There will be a surge in staffing demand, as the industry is expected to need roughly 16% more employees by the year 2031* in the Museum and Arts industry alone. 






Agency Collection Comparison


