9	its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the

11	SEC	CTION	10. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION -
12	LANGU	AGE	ESSENTIALS FOR TEACHERS OF READING AND SPELLING. There is
13	appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise		
14	appropriated, the sum of \$2,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the		
15	department of public instruction for the purpose of a language essentials for teachers of reading		
16	and spelling training system, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30,		
17	2025. The department of public instruction may partner with the regional centers of excellence		
18	to administer the program. The training system must:		
19	1.	Prov	vide educators with the knowledge to effectively implement any classwide,
20		supp	plemental, or intervention reading approach based on scientific reading research
21		and	to evaluate the causes of certain students' challenges with reading, writing,
22		spel	lling, and language;
23	2.	Prov	vide training activities that direct educators to implement effective reading and
24		spel	ling instruction supported by scientifically based research and foster a direct
25		expl	licit instructional sequence that uses techniques to support teachers'
26		inde	pendence to use their skills in the classroom;
27	3.	Inclu	ude integrated components for educators and administrators in prekindergarten
28		thro	ugh grade five with embedded knowledge assessment. Knowledge assessment
29		mus	t include evaluations throughout each unit and the completion of a summative

assessment to demonstrate successful course completion;

- 4. Build teacher content knowledge and pedagogical knowledge of the critical components of literacy including the brain's learning to read process, phonological and phonemic awareness, letter knowledge, phonics, advanced phonics, vocabulary and oral language, fluency, comprehension, spelling and writing, and the organization of language;
- Support educators to effectively use screening, progress monitoring, and diagnostic
 assessment data to improve literacy outcomes through prevention and intervention for
 reading difficulties in a multitiered system of supports;
- 6. Have a proven track record of more than five years of experience at scale; and
- 7. Require a minimum of ninety hours of instruction.

SECTION 11. APPROPRIATION - PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FUND - DEPARTMENT OF

PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - SCIENCE OF READING - REPORT. There is appropriated out of any
moneys in the public instruction fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum
of \$1,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of public
instruction for the purpose of supporting professional learning related to the science of reading
and implementing systematic direct literacy instruction, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023,
and ending June 30, 2025. The superintendent of public instruction shall collaborate with the
regional education associations to ensure continuity of access to science of reading training
opportunities and develop support processes to deepen science of reading implementation. The
superintendent of public instruction shall provide quarterly reports to the legislative
management on the implementation and effectiveness of this appropriation on improving
educational outcomes, including the number of teachers trained, an anticipated timeline of
results trends, and any results trends available.

SECTION 12. EXEMPTION - TRANSFER - PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FUND.

Notwithstanding section 54-44.1-11, if, after the superintendent of public instruction complies with all statutory payment obligations imposed for the 2021-23 biennium, any moneys remain in the integrated formula payments line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of chapter 13 of the 2021 Session Laws, the lesser of \$1,000,000 or the remaining amount must be continued into the 2023-25 biennium and the office of management and budget shall transfer this amount into the public instruction fund for the purpose of funding professional learning related to the science of
