- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 62.1-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to restrictions on the possession, use, and manufacture of knives; and to
- 3 amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 62.1-01-01 section 62.1-04-01 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to the definition of dangerous weapon concealed for firearms and
- 5 dangerous weapons.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 62.1-01-01 of the North Dakota-Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1. "Dangerous weapon" includes any switchblade or gravity knife, machete, scimitar, stiletto, sword, dagger, or knife with a blade of five inches [12.7 centimeters] or more: any throwing star, nunchaku, or other martial arts weapon; any billy, blackjack, sap, bludgeon, cudgel, metal knuckles, or sand club; any slungshot; any bow and arrow, crossbow, or spear; any weapon that will expel, or is readily capable of expelling, a projectile by the action of a spring, compressed air, or compressed gas, including any such weapon, loaded or unloaded, commonly referred to as a BB gun, air rifle, or CO2 gun; and any projector of a bomb or any object containing or capable of producing and emitting any nexious liquid, gas, or substance. "Dangerous weapon" does not include a spray or aerosol containing CS, also known as ortho-chlorobenzamalonitrile; CN, also known as alpha-chloroacetophenone; or other irritating agent intended for use inthe defense of an individual, nor does the term include a device that uses voltage for the defense of an individual, unless the device uses a projectile and voltage or the device uses a projectile and may be used to apply multiple applications of voltageduring a single incident, then the term includes the device for an individual who isprohibited from possessing a firearm under this title.

1	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 62.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created	
2	and enacted as follows:	
3	Limitation on authority of political subdivision regarding knives.	
4	<u>1.</u>	As used in this section "knife" means a cutting instrument with a sharpened or pointed
5		blade.
6	<u>2.</u>	A political subdivision may not enact any ordinance, rule, or tax relating to the
7		transportation, possession, carry, sale, transfer, purchase, gift, devise, licensure,
8		registration, or use of a knife or knifemaking components. All such existing rules or
9		ordinances are void.
10	<u>3.</u>	A political subdivision may not enact any rule or ordinance relating to the manufacture
11		of a knife which is more restrictive than any rule or ordinance relating to the
12		manufacture of any other commercial good. All such existing rules or ordinances are
13		void.
14	4	This section does not apply to an ordinance, rule, tax, or regulation enacted by a
15		political subdivision which prohibits the possession of a knife on property or in a
16		building owned, leased, or possessed by the political subdivision.
17	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 62.1-04-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
18	amended and reenacted as follows:	
19	62.1-04-01. Definition of concealed.	
20	A firearm or dangerous weapon is concealed if it is carried in such a manner as to not be	
<sup>'</sup> 21	discernible by the ordinary observation of a passerby. There is no requirement that there be	
22	absolute invisibility of the firearm or dangerous weapon, merely that it not be ordinarily	
23	discernible. A firearm or dangerous weapon is considered concealed if it is not secured, and is	
24	worn under clothing or carried in a bundle that is held or carried by the individual, or transported	
25	in a vehicle under the individual's control or direction and available to the individual, including	
. 26	beneath the seat or in a glove compartment. A firearm or dangerous weapon is not considered	
27	concealed if it is:	
28	1.	Carried in a belt holster which is wholly or substantially visible or carried in a case
29		designed for carrying a firearm or dangerous weapon and which is wholly or
30		substantially visible;
31	2.	Locked in a closed trunk or luggage compartment of a motor vehicle;

- Carried in the field while lawfully engaged in hunting, fishing, trapping, camping, field
  work, or target shooting, or a knife designed as a kitchen knife while en route to or
  from a place of employment, whether visible or not;
- 4. Carried by any person permitted by law to possess a handgun unloaded and in a secure wrapper from the place of purchase to that person's home or place of business, or to a place of repair, or back from those locations;—or
- 5. A bow and arrow, rifle, shotgun, unloaded handgun, or a weapon that will expel, or is readily capable of expelling, a projectile by the action of a spring, compressed air, or compressed gas including any such weapon commonly referred to as a BB gun, air rifle, or CO<sub>2</sub> gun, while carried in a motor vehicle; or
- 6. A switchblade, gravity knife, stiletto, or dagger, whether visible or not.
