




### House Bill 1015

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - FEDERAL CORONAVIRUS CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND-MATCHING FUNDS - ONE-TIME FUNDING

- 1. There is appropriated from federal funds derived from the federal coronavirus capital projects fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$70,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of career and technical education for the purpose of a statewide area career center initiative grant program for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2023. . . .
- 4. There is appropriated from federal funds derived from the federal coronavirus capital projects fund, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$4,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to Dickinson state university for the purpose of a Pulver hall project, a meat processing laboratory remodel, and other projects for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2023....

9. The funding provided under this section may be spent only to the extent the director of the office of management and budget, in consultation with the budget section, determines the use of the funding complies with federal guidance for the federal coronavirus capital projects fund. The funding provided under this section is considered a one-time funding item.

## **Theodore Roosevelt Digital Library**

- TR wrote over 30 books, hundreds of magazine articles and as many as 150,000 letters
- Film, audio, letters, diaries, scrapbooks, speeches, essays, photographs
- Political cartoons, advertisements, sheet music, and many other types of contextual materials
- Documents of presidents before 1930 are scattered in libraries, archives, and private collections
- TR Center is gathering TR's papers "virtually" equivalent of the archive portion of a presidential library

  - Museum/Physical Space (Medora)
  - Archive/Documents (Dickinson State)
- DSU TR Center is gathering TR's papers "virtually" – equivalent of a presidential library archive

- Library of Congress largest TR collection
  - ~150,000 documents (485 reels of microfilm)
- Harvard University 2<sup>nd</sup> largest collection
- National Park Service
  - Sites where he lived or significant events occurred: Birthplace, Sagamore Hill, Inaugural
  - Sites that commemorate his life and legacy: TR National Park, TR Island, Mount Rushmore
- Sherman Grinberg Film Collection
- Many other institutions and individuals



# **TRDL** - Research Advantages

- Documents in one place
  - Relationships between items held in different places (both sides of the conversation)
  - Both text and visual items (cartoons, photographs, newspaper coverage, etc.) of issues/events
- Searchable by topic, name, date, place
- Available any time, anywhere in the world





### A Revolution...



### NDCC 54-0701254-07-12. Theodore Roosevelt presidential library and museum endowment fund - Continuing appropriation - Budget section report.

House Bill 1003, Section 36. AMENDMENT. Subdivision c of subsection 2 of section 54-07-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

c. The private entity agrees to donate ten million dollars from the one hundred million dollars pursual identified in subsection 1 to a higher education institution foundation in North Dakota, of which two million dollars is for the purpose of creating an endowment to digitize digitizing documents relating to Theodore Roosevelt and eight million dollars is for the purpose of <u>creating an endowment</u> for the creation of a Theodore Roosevelt conservation scholars program and related academic mission at a North Dakota higher education institution in collaboration with the private entity; and


c. The private entity agrees to donate ten million dollars from the one hundred million dollars identified in subsection 1 to a higher education institution foundation in North Dakota for the purpose of creating an endowment to digitize documents relating to Theodore Roosevelt and for the creation of a Theodore Roosevelt conservation scholars program and related academic mission at a North Dakota higher education institution in collaboration with the private entity; and

- d. The private entity agrees to donate three hundred thousand dollars to a city in North Dakota for prior costs incurred related to planning for a presidential library;
- 3. The governor provides a report to the budget section which includes copies of the documentation received for the certification provided in subsection 1: and
- 4. The governor provides a report to the budget section within thirty days of applying for the loan authorized by S.L. 2019, ch. 26, § 8, which includes all completed loan application documents.
