

It was moved by Attorney General Wrigley and seconded by Commissioner Goebring that the Industrial Commission approves the allocation of \$1,000,000 from the Lightie Research Fund for the purpose of supporting litigation costs rolland to North Dakota's Chableage of Maria Capitalian of \$1,000,000 from the Lightie Research Fund for an S.F. 4, that the industrial Commission support ceited lighties costs, and that the Industrial Commission apport the Attorney General's appointment of Special Assatiant Attorneys General

On a roll call vote, Governor Burgum, Attorney General Wrigley, and Commissioner Goebring voted aye. The motion carried unanimously.
