## Other Sections in Game and Fish Department - Budget No. 720

Grants, gifts, and donations

Section 3 would include in the grants, giffs, and donations line item \$100,000 received by the Game and Fish Department for surface damage, easements, or reclamation of department-owned or department-managed properties from oil or mining activities.

Line item transfer authority

Section 4 would authorize the Office of Management and Budget to transfer up to \$2 million of appropriation authority between the operating expenses, capital assets, and grants - game and fish line items during the 2023-25 biennium. The department must report any transfers to the Legislative Council.

Contingent authority and full-time equalivalent positions - Recovering America's Wildlife Act

Section 5 would appropriate \$27,150,000 and would authorize 7 FTE to implement the federal Recovering America's Wildlife Act during the 2023-25 biennium, contingent upon passage of the Recovering America's Wildlife Act.
