Section 3 would transfer \$122,000 from the game and fish operating fund, or federal or other funds available to the Game and Fish Department to the Parks and Recreation Department for maintenance, operating, and extraordinary repair expenses relating to boat ramps at state parks for the 2023-25 biennium. Section 4 would appropriate any additional income from federal or other funds that may become available to the Parks and Recreation Department for the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 5 would identity \$17,375,000 from the legacy earnings fund for building cabins and campground construction at Pembina Gorge for the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 3 transfers \$122,000 from the game and fish operating fund, or federal or other funds available to the Game and Fish Department to the Parks and Recreation Department for maintenance, operating, and extraordinary repair expenses relating to boat ramps at state parks for the 2023-25 biennium.

Executive Budget Recommendation

Section 6 would identify \$13,250,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund for deferred maintenance, capital projects, and parks grants for the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 7 would allow 2013-15 biennium appropriation authority for repair of the Peace Tower to continue to be available in the 2023-25 biennium. The section would also require the Parks and Recreation Department to review and accept engineering proposals and specifications before committing additional funds to the project and to assist with bidding and construction of any work associated with this section.

Section 8 would allow 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for trail lease renewals and construction or purchasing trail easements to continue to be available in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 9 would allow 2019-21 biennium appropriation authority for extraordinary repairs to continue to be available in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 10 would allow 2019-2021 biennium appropriation authority for parks capital projects and International Peace Garden capital projects to continue to be available in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 11 would identify up to \$6 million from the strategic investment and improvements fund for city, county, and tribal programs with a limit of \$750,000 per entity.

Senate Version

Section 7 allows 2013-15 biennium appropriation authority for repair of the Peace Tower to continue to be available for capital projects, extraordinary repairs, and equipment at the International Peace Gardens for the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 8 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for trail lease renewals and construction and repairs or purchasing trail easements to continue to be available in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 9 allows 2019-21 biennium appropriation authority for extraordinary repairs to continue to be available in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 10 allows 2019-2021 biennium appropriation authority for parks capital projects and International Peace Garden capital projects to be available for capital projects and equipment in the 2023--25 biennium.

Section 12 allows the 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for Fort Abraham Lincoln viewshed to be available for plantings to improve the viewshed in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 13 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for extraordinary repairs to continue to be available in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 14 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for any remaining federal state recovery funds to continue to be available for deferred maintenance and capital projects in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 15 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for any remaining federal state recovery funds to continue to be available for grants to local park districts to renovate and upgrade existing facilities in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 16 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for any remaining federal state recovery funds to continue to be available for capital project improvements at state parks, subject to the department obtaining matching funds from nonstate sources for each project on a dollar-for-dollar basis in the 2023-25 biennium.
