



Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Voucher



Since its inception in July 2016 approximately 5,800 individuals have received services through the SUD Voucher.

Since July 1, 2021, the SUD Voucher Program has approved **2,162 new applications**.

As of December 31, 2022, **1,207 clients** are actively being served.

- Rates increased as of January 15, 2023
- Grant awarded to Heartview (16-bed facility in Dickinson)

Goal: learn with schools on how a fully integrated continuum of support could look in various schools throughout North Dakota.


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


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
