# **Economic Assistance Programs and Services**



#### **Child Care Assistance**

Pay a portion of the cost of childcare for working families or families in training or education programs.



#### **Housing Stability**

Assist renters struggling to pay rent and utilities and homeowners at risk of housing instability with financial assistance to support housing costs.



# Supplemental Nutrition Assistance

Provide nutrition benefits to supplement the food budget of needy families so they can purchase healthy food.



#### **Home Energy Assistance**

Help households with home heating costs by paying a portion of their heating bills and assisting with home modifications to support energy efficiency.



# **Temporary Assistance for Needy Families**

Serve families with children who are deprived of parental support or care due to divorce, separation, death or one or both parents being aged or disabled.



#### **Long-Term Care Eligibility**

Determine Medicaid eligibility for individuals seeking Long-Term Care, Basic Care and Home & Community Based Services.



# Additional support to families



#### **Nutrition Education**

Provide SNAP eligible individuals with nutrition education focusing on:

- Increasing fruit and vegetable consumption
- Balancing healthful food with physical activity
- Helping families get the most nutrition for their food dollar



#### **Work support**

- Help individuals who are able to work take meaningful steps to achieve greater self sufficiency.
- Resources to help with costs associated with seeking and maintaining employment, such as child care, transportation, vehicle repairs, insurance, uniforms and certifications.



#### Home energy modifications

Offer weatherization services such as:

- Insulating, weather stripping and chimney cleanings
- Minor furnace and cooling device repair
- Replacement of inefficient or inoperable heating systems



## Connecting Families to Economic Assistance is a Partnership


The state and Human Service Zones (HSZs) work together to deliver help to low and moderate-income families

#### **Human Service Zone**

The applicant can contact their human service zone directly or they can simply apply online.

#### **Determine eligibility**

An eligibility worker determines eligibility.



Making ends meet is getting more difficult every month so the applicant makes the decision to reach out for help.

#### **Gather information**

The applicant can enter as much info as they can in the SPACES self-service portal.

#### Issue benefits

If the applicant is eligible to receive assistance, the state will issue the benefit in the appropriate manner.

# Working Better Together



Health and Human Services and Human Service Zones have worked together to redesign the delivery of eligibility determination that supports Economic Assistance and Medicaid coverage.


#### **GOALS OF REDESIGN:**

- Level the workload so each worker has the capacity to handle the volume and the complexity.
- Process applications in a timely manner.
- Simplify the process to serve customers efficiently.
- Decrease errors and issue all the benefits a family is eligible to receive at the right time.



# Redesign Implementation: February 2023







#### Four Regions – Each Working as One Team

Human Service Zones in each region will work together as one team.



#### **Local Support**

Local offices will remain open for in-person support.



#### **Customer Support Center**

One phone number to speak to an expert in eligibility services.



#### **Centralized Mail Unit**

One mail and one email address for document submission.



#### **Self-Service Portal Upgrade**

Work has been done on the SSP to make it more user and mobile friendly.



# Child Care Assistance Program Milestones



#### March 2021

Utilize COVID funds to waive family copays and pay providers based on maximum state rates.



#### **November 2022**

Transitioned to a prospective payment model. This allows for assistance payments to occur at the beginning of the month based on the child's enrollment.

Prior to this change, reimbursement was made the month after care.



#### February 2022

Increased the eligibility limit to 85% of State Median Income.





#### November 2022

Enhanced the provider portal in SPACES to:

- Allow for prospective payments
- Provide payment via direct deposit
- Eliminate paper billing forms
- Allows provider to access their account via a mobile device

# Home Energy Assistance Program Milestones



#### September 2021

Integrated LIHEAP eligibility determination into SPACES.

\*Represented the final step to fully integrate eligibility determinations for all Economic Assistance and Medicaid programs.




#### **July 2022**


Expanded the cooling assistance program in 2022 to include all LIHEAP eligible families. Program provides cooling devices.

### **SNAP PROGRAM MILESTONES**

#### School Years 19-20 and 20-21

Operated a Pandemic EBT Program, providing SNAP benefits to children eligible for free or reduced-price meals who missed those meals due to school closures or virtual learning.



#### Summer PEBT 2022 & planned for 2023

Operated a summer Pandemic EBT Program, providing SNAP benefit to school age children and children in child care with additional assistance to help families with food and nutrition costs.



#### October 2021


Implemented a 27% increase in the SNAP benefit level based on a Federal increase in the Thrifty Food Plan.




#### February 2022

Implemented a third-party earned income verification system, streamlining eligibility determinations and reducing burden on families. This was made possible through a federal SNAP data grant award.

#### **Financial Support**

Suggestions include:

- Increase TANF grant to create a more impactful benefit
- Increase Post & Transitional Assistance
- Expand financial management skills and education



#### **Administrative Barriers**

Suggestions include:

- Eliminate pay-afterperformance policy
- Eliminate monthly reporting and streamline the application process
- Remove benefit cap policy



#### **Support Services**

Suggestions include:

- Better options for delivering support services – electronic or direct deposit
- Increase transportation allowance
- Consider alternative approaches for rural communities









NW ND Emergency Housing Stability storm response (temporary program)






- +\$37.9 M child care assistance (child care / workforce proposal)


