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Section 6 identifies \$12.5 million from the strategic investment and improvements fund; of which \$10 million is for deferred maintenance and capital projects, \$250,000 is for the Lake Metigoshe reimagined project, \$1.5 million is for state park matching grants, and \$750,000 is for city, county, and tribal park system grants for the 2023-25 biennium.

Subsection 1 of section 8 allows 2013-15 biennium appropriation authority for repair of the Peace Tower to continue to be available for capital projects, extraordinary repairs, and equipment at the International Peace Gardens for the 2023-25 biennium.

Subsection 4 of section 8 allows 2019-2021 biennium appropriation authority for parks capital projects and International Peace Garden capital projects to be available for any capital projects and equipment in the 2023-25 biennium.

Section 7 identifies up to \$750,000 from the strategic investment and improvements fund for city, county, and tribal programs with a limit of \$100,000 per entity.

Subsection 5 of section 8 allows the 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for Fort Abraham Lincoln viewshed to be available for plantings to improve the viewshed in the 2023-25 biennium.

Subsection 6 of section 8 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for extraordinary repairs to continue to be available in the 2023-25 biennium.

Subsection 7 of section 8 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for any remaining federal state recovery funds to continue to be available for deferred maintenance and capital projects in the 2023-25 biennium

Subsection 8 of section 8 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for any remaining federal state recovery funds to continue to be available for grants to local park districts to renovate and upgrade existing facilities in the 2023-25 biennium.

Subsection 9 of section 8 allows 2021-23 biennium appropriation authority for any remaining federal state recovery funds to continue to be available for capital project improvements at state parks, subject to the department obtaining matching funds from nonstate sources for each project on a dollar-for-dollar basis in the 2023-25 biennium.
