**FIRST ENGROSSMENT  
with Senate Amendments**

**ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1008**

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service  
2 commission; to amend and reenact sections 49-01-05 and 57-43.2-19 of the North Dakota  
3 Century Code, relating to the salaries of the public service commissioners and deposits of  
4 special fuels excise taxes; and to provide loan authorization.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds  
7 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state  
8 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from other funds derived from special funds and  
9 federal funds, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the  
10 public service commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027,  
11 as follows:

6 **SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO**

7 **SEVENTIETH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The following amounts reflect the one-time funding  
8 items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act which are not included in the entity's  
9 base budget for the 2027-29 biennium and which the entity shall report to the appropriations  
10 committees of the seventieth legislative assembly regarding the use of this funding:

15 **SECTION 3. NEW AND VACANT FTE POOL - LIMITATION - TRANSFER REQUEST.** The  
16 public service commission may not spend funds appropriated in the new and vacant FTE pool  
17 line item in section 1 of this Act, but may request the office of management and budget to  
18 transfer funds from the new and vacant FTE pool line item to the salaries and wages and  
19 railroad safety program line items in accordance with the guidelines and reporting provisions  
20 included in House Bill No. 1015, as approved by the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.

21 **SECTION 4. RAIL RATE COMPLAINT CASE - LOAN AUTHORIZATION.** The public  
22 service commission may obtain a loan from the Bank of North Dakota for costs associated with  
23 a rail rate complaint case. The loan may not exceed \$900,000, and the interest rate associated  
24 with the loan must be the prevailing interest rate charged to North Dakota governmental  
25 entities. The public service commission shall repay the loan from amounts available from  
26 damages or proceeds received, net of legal fees, from a successful outcome of a rail complaint  
27 case. If moneys anticipated to be available on June 30, 2027, are not sufficient to repay the  
28 loan, the public service commission may request a deficiency appropriation from the legislative  
29 assembly to repay the loan.

30 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
31 amended and reenacted as follows:

1       **49-01-05. Salary of commissioners.**

2       The annual salary of a commissioner is ~~one hundred thirty thousand dollars through~~  
3 ~~June 30, 2024, and one hundred thirty-five thousand two hundred~~one hundred thirty-nine  
4 thousand two hundred fifty-six dollars through June 30, 2026, and one hundred forty-three  
5 thousand four hundred thirty-four dollars thereafter. All fees received or charged by any  
6 commissioner for any act or service rendered in any official capacity must be accounted for and  
7 paid over by the commissioner monthly to the state treasurer and must be credited to the  
8 general fund of the state.

9       **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 57-43.2-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11       **57-43.2-19. Transfer, deposit, and distribution of funds.**

12       All taxes, license fees, penalties, and interest collected under this chapter must be  
13 transferred to the state treasurer who shall deposit moneys in a highway tax distribution fund,  
14 except all special fuels excise taxes collected on sales of diesel fuel to a railroad under section  
15 57-43.2-03 of up to ~~three hundred thirty-two thousand three hundred twenty-seven~~three  
16 hundred fifty-two thousand eight hundred ninety-two dollars per year must be transferred to the  
17 state treasurer who shall deposit the moneys in the rail safety fund. The highway tax distribution  
18 fund must be distributed in the manner as prescribed by section 54-27-19.
