**FIRST ENGROSSMENT  
with House Amendments**

**ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2001**

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the legislative branch  
2 of state government; to amend and reenact sections 48-08-04, 54-03-10, 54-03-20, and  
3 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to use of legislative rooms and halls and  
4 legislative compensation; to provide a statement of legislative intent; to provide for a report; to  
5 provide an exemption; and to provide for application, transfer, and cancellation of unexpended  
6 appropriations.

7 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

8 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds  
9 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state  
10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from other funds derived from the insurance  
11 regulatory trust fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the legislative branch of state government  
12 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the legislative branch of state government, for the  
13 fiscal period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2027, as follows:

21 **SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO**

22 **SEVENTIETH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The following amounts reflect the one-time funding  
 23 items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act which are not included in each entity's  
 24 base budget for the 2027-29 biennium and which each entity shall report to the appropriations  
 25 committees of the seventieth legislative assembly regarding the use of this funding:

8 **SECTION 3. NEW AND VACANT FTE POOL - BUDGET SECTION REPORT.**

- 9 1. The legislative council may not spend funds from the new and vacant FTE pool line  
10 item in subdivision 2 of section 1 of this Act, but may transfer funds from this line item  
11 to the salaries and wages line item as necessary to provide funding for:
- 12 a. Filling a new FTE position from the date of hire through the end of the biennium;  
13 or  
14 b. Salaries and wages if actual salaries and wages savings from vacant positions  
15 and employee turnover adjusted for other uses are less than the estimate used  
16 by the sixty-ninth legislative assembly in the development of the appropriation.
- 17 2. The legislative council shall report to the budget section regarding the use of funding  
18 in the pool including information on:
- 19 a. New FTE positions, including the date hired;  
20 b. Vacant FTE positions, including information on positions that become vacant and  
21 positions filled, salaries and wages savings resulting from vacant positions and  
22 employee turnover, and the use of salaries and wages savings for other  
23 purposes; and  
24 c. Additional salaries and wages funding needed due to savings from vacant  
25 positions being less than anticipated.
- 26 3. If funding in the new and vacant FTE pool line item is insufficient to provide the  
27 necessary salaries and wages funding for the biennium, the legislative council may  
28 request a deficiency appropriation from the seventieth legislative assembly.

29 **SECTION 4. EXEMPTION - TRANSFERS.** Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director  
30 of the office of management and budget shall transfer appropriation authority between line items  
31 of the legislative management and legislative council as may be requested by the chairman of

1 the legislative management or the director of the legislative council upon the finding by the  
2 chairman or the director that the nature of studies and duties assigned to the legislative  
3 management or legislative council requires the transfers in properly carrying on the legislative  
4 management's and legislative council's functions and duties. The director of the office of  
5 management and budget shall similarly make transfers of appropriation authority between the  
6 line items for the sixty-ninth and seventieth legislative assemblies, upon request by the  
7 chairman of the legislative management or the director of the legislative council upon the finding  
8 by the chairman or director that the transfers are required for the legislative assembly to carry  
9 on its functions and duties.

10 **SECTION 5. APPLICATION, TRANSFER AUTHORITY, AND CANCELLATION OF**  
11 **UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATIONS.** Sections 54-16-04 and 54-44.1-11 do not apply to  
12 chapter 1 of the 2023 Session Laws. The director of the office of management and budget shall  
13 make transfers of appropriation authority between the line items and the agencies of the  
14 legislative branch within section 1 of that chapter as requested by the chairman of the legislative  
15 management or the director of the legislative council. The office of management and budget  
16 shall cancel unexpended appropriations for the legislative assembly and legislative council  
17 enacted prior to the 2023-25 biennium as directed by the chairman of the legislative  
18 management or the director of the legislative council.

19 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 48-08-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
20 amended and reenacted as follows:

21 **48-08-04. Use of legislative assembly rooms, and halls, and other space in the**  
22 **capitol.**

23 During the interim between legislative sessions, the committee rooms, halls, passageways,  
24 and other space in the capitol used by the legislative assembly, including the pioneer room, the  
25 coteau room, the Sheyenne River room, judicial wing room 216, and judicial wing rooms 327 B,  
26 C, and E, may not be used without authorization of the legislative council. The fifteenth floor of  
27 the capitol is reserved for the exclusive use of the legislative council.

28 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-03-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
29 amended and reenacted as follows:

1           **54-03-10. Compensation of speaker, majority and minority leaders, assistant majority**  
2 **and minority leaders, committee chairmen, and employees.**

3           The speaker of the house, the house majority leader, the senate majority leader, the house  
4 minority leader, and the senate minority leader shall each receive as compensation, in addition  
5 to any other compensation or expense reimbursement provided by law, the sum of ~~fifteen~~twenty  
6 dollars per day for each calendar day during any regular, special, or organizational session.  
7 Chairmen of the substantive standing committees, the house assistant majority leader, the  
8 senate assistant majority leader, the house assistant minority leader, and the senate assistant  
9 minority leader shall receive additional compensation of ~~ten~~fifteen dollars for each calendar day  
10 during any regular, special, or organizational session. The additional compensation provided by  
11 this section must be paid in the manner provided in section 54-03-20. The legislative assembly,  
12 by concurrent resolution, shall fix the compensation of the other officers and employees elected  
13 or appointed.

14           **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-03-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
15 amended and reenacted as follows:

16           **54-03-20. Compensation and expense reimbursement of members of the legislative**  
17 **assembly.**

- 18           1. Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive as compensation for  
19 services the sum of ~~two hundred fifty~~two hundred nineteen dollars through June 30,  
20 ~~2024~~2026, and ~~two hundred thirteen~~two hundred twenty-six dollars thereafter for each  
21 calendar day during any organizational, special, or regular legislative session and for  
22 each day that member attends a meeting of a legislative committee between the  
23 organizational session and the regular session as authorized by legislative rule.
- 24           2. a. Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive reimbursement for  
25 lodging, which may not exceed per calendar month the amount established under  
26 this subdivision by the director of the office of management and budget for  
27 lodging in state and which may not exceed the rate provided in section 44-08-04  
28 for each calendar day during the period of any organizational, special, or regular  
29 session. On August first of each even-numbered year, the director of the office of  
30 management and budget shall set the maximum monthly reimbursement for the  
31 subsequent two-year period at an amount equal to thirty times seventy percent of

- 1                   the daily lodging reimbursement in effect on that date as provided under  
2                   subdivision d of subsection 2 of section 44-08-04.
- 3           b.   Notwithstanding subdivision a:
- 4                   (1)   A member of the legislative assembly may elect to be reimbursed for less  
5                   than the amount to which the legislator is entitled under this subsection by  
6                   claiming the lesser amount on a voucher submitted with the receipt required  
7                   by section 44-08-04.
- 8                   (2)   The legislative management may establish guidelines that may result in a  
9                   reduced maximum reimbursement for a single dwelling in which two or more  
10                  legislators share lodging and the total rent for that dwelling exceeds the  
11                  amount to which a legislator is entitled under subdivision a.
- 12          3.   a.   Members of the legislative assembly who receive reimbursement for lodging are  
13                  also entitled to reimbursement for travel for not to exceed one round trip taken  
14                  during any calendar week, or portion of a week, the legislative assembly is in  
15                  session, between their residences and the place of meeting of the legislative  
16                  assembly, at the rate provided for state employees with the additional limitation  
17                  that reimbursement for travel by common carrier may be only at the cost of coach  
18                  fare and may not exceed one and one-half times the amount the member would  
19                  be entitled to receive as mileage reimbursement for travel by motor vehicle.
- 20                  b.   A member of the legislative assembly who does not receive reimbursement for  
21                  lodging and whose place of residence in the legislative district that the member  
22                  represents is not within the city of Bismarck is entitled to reimbursement at the  
23                  rate provided for state employees for necessary travel for not to exceed one  
24                  round trip taken per day between the residence and the place of meeting of the  
25                  legislative assembly when it is in session and may receive reimbursement for  
26                  lodging at the place of meeting of the legislative assembly as provided in section  
27                  44-08-04 for each calendar day for which round trip travel reimbursement is not  
28                  claimed, provided that the total reimbursement may not exceed the maximum  
29                  monthly reimbursement allowed under subdivision a of subsection 2.
- 30          4.   The amount to which each legislator is entitled must be paid following the  
31                  organizational session in December and each month upon submission of a voucher

1 and appropriate documentation during a regular or special session, consistent with  
2 section 26 of article XI of the constitution of North Dakota.

3 5. If during a special session, the legislative assembly adjourns for more than three days,  
4 a member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive compensation during those  
5 days only while in attendance at a standing committee if the legislator is a member of  
6 that committee, a majority or minority leader, or a legislator who is not on that  
7 committee but who has the approval of a majority or minority leader to attend.

8 6. A day, or portion of a day, spent in traveling to or returning from an organizational,  
9 special, or regular session or a legislative committee meeting must be included as a  
10 calendar day during a legislative session or as a day of a legislative committee  
11 meeting for the purposes of this section.

12 7. a. In addition, each member is entitled to receive during the term for which the  
13 member was elected, as compensation for the execution of public duties during  
14 the biennium, the sum of ~~five hundred sixty-nine~~six hundred ten dollars through  
15 June 30, ~~2024~~2026, and ~~five hundred ninety-two~~six hundred twenty-eight dollars  
16 thereafter per month, paid monthly.

17 b. If a member dies or resigns from office during the member's term, the member  
18 may be paid only the allowances provided for in this section for the period for  
19 which the member was actually a member.

20 c. The majority and minority leaders of the house and senate and the chairman of  
21 the legislative management, if the chairman is not a majority or minority leader,  
22 are each entitled to receive as compensation, in addition to any other  
23 compensation or expense reimbursement provided by law, the sum of ~~four~~  
24 ~~hundred eight~~four hundred thirty-seven dollars through June 30, ~~2024~~2026, and  
25 ~~four hundred twenty-four~~four hundred fifty dollars thereafter per month during the  
26 biennium for their execution of public duties.

27 8. Attendance at any organizational, special, or regular session of the legislative  
28 assembly by any member is a conclusive presumption of entitlement as set out in this  
29 section and compensation and expense allowances must be excluded from gross  
30 income for income tax purposes to the extent permitted for federal income tax

1 purposes under section 127 of the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 [Pub. L. 97-34;  
2 95 Stat. 202; 26 U.S.C. 162(i)].

3 9. Before each regular legislative session, the legislative management shall make  
4 recommendations and submit any necessary legislation to adjust legislative  
5 compensation amounts.

6 **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **54-35-10. Compensation of members and leadership.**

9 1. The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of  
10 the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in  
11 attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate  
12 of ~~two hundred fifty~~two hundred nineteen dollars through June 30, ~~2024~~2026, and ~~two-~~  
13 ~~hundred thirteen~~two hundred twenty-six dollars thereafter per day and must also be  
14 paid for expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their  
15 official duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.

16 2. In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the  
17 legislative management is entitled to receive an additional ~~five~~ten dollars for each day  
18 spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,  
19 and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to  
20 receive ~~five~~ten dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative  
21 management or of the committee which the person chairs.

22 **SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT - CHAMBER**

23 **ACCESSIBILITY.** It is the intent of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly that the legislative  
24 management review the accessibility of the legislative chambers and gather information  
25 regarding options to improve access.
