

**FIRST ENGROSSMENT
with Senate Amendments**

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1317

1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 43-04 of the North Dakota
2 Century Code, relating to restricted, temporary, and retired barber licenses; to amend and
3 reenact sections 43-04-01, 43-04-04, 43-04-06, 43-04-30, 43-04-30.1, 43-04-32, and 43-04-42
4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the board of barber examiners, barber licensing,
5 continuing education, and fees; and to provide a penalty.

6 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-04-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 **43-04-01. Definitions.**

10 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:

- 11 1. "Board" means the board of barber examiners.
- 12 2. "Licensed barber" means a licensee who has:
 - 13 a. Met the requirements defined in sections 43-04-31 and 43-04-32; and
 - 14 b. Passed the examination required in section 43-04-33.
- 15 3. "Practice of barbering" includes any one or any combination of the following practices
16 when done upon the upper part of the human body for cosmetic purposes and not for
17 the treatment of diseases or physical or mental ailments, and when done for payment
18 either directly or indirectly:
 - 19 a. Shaving or trimming the beard or cutting the hair.
 - 20 b. Giving facial or scalp massages or treatments with oils, creams, lotions, or other
21 preparations either by hand or mechanical appliances.
 - 22 c. Singeing, shampooing, or dyeing the hair or applying hair tonics.

1 d. Applying cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, powders, oils, clays, or lotions to
2 scalp, face, neck, or upper part of the body.

3 4. "Restricted barber" means a licensee, limited in practice to specific areas in which
4 competence has been demonstrated, and allowed to work in a licensed host shop.

5 5. "Retired barber" means a licensee who meets the requirements of section 9 of this
6 Act.

7 6. "Temporary barber" means an eligible licensee who is permitted to practice under the
8 supervision of a licensed barber until results are available from the next scheduled
9 examination.

10 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-04-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11 amended and reenacted as follows:

12 **43-04-04. Board of barber examiners - Appointment - Term of office - Qualifications.**

13 1. The board of barber examiners must consist of at least three members, each of whom
14 must be appointed by the governor for a term of three years.

15 2. Members are subject to the following requirements:

16 a. The terms of office of the members must be so arranged that one term expires on
17 the thirty-first day of December of each year;

18 b. Each appointment must be made from a list of five names submitted to the
19 governor by the state barber association; and each

20 c. Each member must be a registered barber who has followed the occupation of
21 barber in this state for at least five years prior to before that member's
22 appointment.

23 3. Two additional members, who shall serve as nonvoting ex officio members and are not
24 required to be licensed barbers, may be appointed by the board for tasks including:

25 a. New and annual shop inspections; and

26 b. Office duties.

27 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-04-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
28 amended and reenacted as follows:

29 **43-04-06. Officers of board - Power to administer oath - Bond.**

30 The members of the board shall elect from ~~their number~~ those members appointed by the
31 governor under section 43-04-04 a president, vice president, and secretary-treasurer. The

1 secretary-treasurer of the board must be bonded for the faithful discharge of duties in the penal
2 sum of five thousand dollars. The secretary-treasurer and the president of the board may
3 administer oaths.

4 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-04-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **43-04-30. Barber - Certificate of registration required - Rules.**

7 1. A person~~An individual~~ may not practice barbering within this state unless the ~~person~~
8 holds a certificate of registration and is registered as a barber or holds a permit to
9 practice as a journeyman barber individual is licensed and registered as:

10 a. A barber;

11 b. A restricted barber;

12 c. A retired barber; or

13 d. A temporary barber.

14 2. The board shall adopt rules regulating licensing, including procedures, requirements,
15 and fees.

16 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-04-30.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
17 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 **43-04-30.1. Continuing education requirements.**

19 1. The board may adopt rules establishing requirements for the continuing education of
20 ~~persons~~individuals licensed under this chapter. ~~Rules for accreditation of continuing~~
21 ~~education must allow accreditation for a variety of types of continuing education~~
22 ~~forums, including live presentations and correspondence education.~~The rules must
23 provide:

24 a. Individuals holding a barber license or a barber instructor license shall complete
25 a minimum of six hours of continuing education every two years;

26 b. Education requirements must be met before the August first deadline; and

27 c. Accreditation hours may be completed through a variety of continuing education
28 forums, including seminars, workshops, annual conventions, and video courses.

29 2. The board may suspend, revoke, place on probationary status, impose a fine on, or
30 refuse to renew any license issued under this chapter if the licensee fails to meet the
31 continuing education requirements established by the board.

- 1 3. An applicant for accreditation of continuing education courses, classes, or activities
2 may be charged a reasonable fee determined by the board.

3 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-04-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 **43-04-32. BarberLicensed barber - Application for examination.**

- 6 ~~1. Any person who desires to take the examination for a certificate of registration to~~
7 ~~practice as a registered barber shall make application to the board on blanks prepared~~
8 ~~and furnished by the board and shall enclose with the application all of the following:~~
- 9 ~~1. Proof, under oath, of the person's qualifications.~~
 - 10 ~~2. A five-inch by three-inch [12.7-centimeter by 7.62-centimeter] signed photograph of~~
11 ~~that person. The person also shall present such a photograph to the board when the~~
12 ~~person appears for examination.~~
 - 13 ~~3. The required fee.~~
 - 14 ~~4. A certificate showing graduation from a public or recognized private high school or an~~
15 ~~equivalent education as determined by an examination conducted by the board;~~
16 ~~provided, however, that two years armed service should be termed equivalent~~
17 ~~education. be licensed as a barber shall apply to the board.~~
 - 18 2. An applicant is eligible to take the licensing examination under section 43-04-33 if the
19 applicant pays the required application fee and:
 - 20 a. Has held an active and valid license to practice barbering in another state for at
21 least one year; or
 - 22 b. Has received a minimum of one thousand one hundred hours of training in
23 sanitation, safety, laws, and rules, including the completion of hours at a licensed
24 barbering school or a barbering program in a public school system, and other
25 procedures as established by the board.
 - 26 3. The board shall issue a license to an applicant who meets the qualifications under
27 section 43-04-31, passes the licensing examination under section 43-04-33, and pays
28 the initial licensing fee.
 - 29 4. An applicant who fails to pass the examination under section 43-04-33 may take
30 subsequent examinations as necessary, subject to the following:
 - 31 a. The board may specify reasonable time frames for rescheduling the examination;

- 1 a. An individual who fails the examination on the individual's first attempt may
2 continue practicing under the supervision of a licensed barber in a licensed
3 barbershop, provided the individual applies for the next examination;
- 4 b. The individual may continue to practice under the licensed barber until the
5 individual receives the results of the second examination; and
- 6 c. An individual may not continue to practice under this subsection if the individual
7 fails to pass the examination on the second attempt.

8 **SECTION 8.** A new section to chapter 43-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
9 and enacted as follows:

10 **Temporary barber license - Requirements.**

- 11 1. An individual who has met the requirements in subsection 2 of section 43-04-32 may
12 apply for and be issued a temporary barber license, upon payment of the required fee.
- 13 2. A license under this section:
 - 14 a. Is valid for a maximum of three months;
 - 15 b. Must begin from the verified date of graduation or completion of training; and
 - 16 c. May be exercised only under the supervision of a licensed barber until results are
17 available from the next scheduled examination.
- 18 3. If the temporary license holder fails the examination, the temporary license holder may
19 apply for an extension of the individual's license under this chapter, pay the fee, and
20 register for the next scheduled examination.

21 **SECTION 9.** A new section to chapter 43-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
22 and enacted as follows:

23 **Retired barber license - Requirements.**

- 24 1. An individual may apply for a retired barber license and practice in a limited capacity if
25 the applicant is:
 - 26 a. At least sixty-five years of age or has been practicing a minimum of twenty years
27 as a licensed barber; and
 - 28 b. Works no more than five days per month.
- 29 2. Upon an applicant meeting the qualifications under this section and paying the initial
30 licensing fee, the board shall issue a retired barber license.

1 **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-04-42 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **43-04-42. Fees.**

4 1. The board may charge applicants the following fees:

5 a. For examination and issuance of a certificate to practice master barbering, one
6 hundred dollars.

7 b. For renewal of a master barber's certificate, one hundred dollars.

8 c. For restoration of an expired master barber's certificate, a twenty dollar penalty
9 fee in addition to the regular renewal fee.

10 d. For a permit to operate a barber school or college, an annual fee of one hundred
11 twenty-five dollars.

12 e. For issuance of an annual barbershop license, fifty dollars, to be paid by each
13 shop owner in advance.

14 f. For issuance of a certificate to an applicant who qualifies under section
15 43-04-38.1, one hundred seventy-five dollars.

16 g. For restoration of an expired barbershop license, a twenty dollar penalty fee in
17 addition to the annual license fee.

18 h. For renewal of an instructor's license, ~~twenty-five~~two hundred fifty dollars.

19 2. Each application to open or establish a barbershop in this state must be accompanied
20 by a fee of one hundred dollars to cover expenses of inspection, which must be
21 retained by the board and deposited as other fees.

22 3. A duplicate license, certificate, or permit must be issued upon:

23 a. Filing a statement verified by the oath of the applicant which explains the loss;

24 b. Submitting a signed photograph of the applicant; and

25 c. Paying a fee of ten dollars for the issuance of the duplicate.

26 4. Anyone who becomes a member of the armed forces of the United States in time of
27 war, while holding a license as a barber or apprentice, and while in good standing as
28 to payment of fees, may obtain a certificate restoration without payment of the
29 restoration fee.
