- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 6 of section 15.1-21-02.10 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to requirements to qualify for the North Dakota scholarship.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.
