1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 15-10-38.1 of the North
2 Dakota Century Code, relating to eligibility for the skilled workforce student loan repayment
3 program; and to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 15-10-38.2 of the North Dakota
4 Century Code, relating to eligibility for the skilled workforce scholarship program.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1.** A new subsection to section 15-10-38.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 created and enacted as follows:

8 The requirement under subdivision c of subsection 4 is met if an individual is enrolled
9 in or has completed a master of science degree in nursing while teaching four clinical
10 credits per year and resides and works in this state in an occupation requiring the
11 degree.

12 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 4 of section 15-10-38.2 of the North Dakota
13 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

14 4. The state board of higher education and the workforce development council shall
15 compile a list of qualifying educational programs annually. A qualifying educational
16 program is:

17 a. Is a program resulting in attainment of an associate's degree or lower credential
18 program that may be completed within four semesters, six quarters, or the final
19 two years of a baccalaureate program. A qualifying educational program also
20 must

- 1 b. Must pertain to the professional and technical skills and emerging occupations in
2 high demand in this state, as determined under subsection 3. ~~Qualifying~~
3 ~~educational programs may~~
- 4 c. May include degree or certificate programs.
- 5 d. Notwithstanding any other requirements under this subsection, is a program
6 resulting in attainment of a master of science degree in nursing, if the individual
7 teaches four clinical credits per calendar year.
