# PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SECOND ENGROSSMENT

#### **REENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1540**

## Introduced by

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 15.1 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to an education savings account program; to provide an appropriation; and to
- 3 provide an effective date.

### 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 15.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 6 enacted as follows:
- 7 <u>Definitions.</u>
- 8 As used in this chapter:
- 9 1. "Administrator" means an organization registered by the secretary of state to do
  10 business in North Dakota and designated by the Bank of North Dakota to assist in the
- 11 <u>implementation of this chapter.</u>
- 12 <u>2. "Department" means the department of public instruction.</u>
- 3. "Education service provider" means an individual or organization approved to provide
- 14 <u>qualified education services. The term does not include a participating school.</u>
- 4. "Eligible postsecondary institution" means a community college, an accredited
  university, or an accredited private postsecondary institution.
- 17 <u>5.</u> <u>"Eligible student" means:</u>
- 18 <u>a. An an elementary or secondary student who is a resident of this state and is</u>
- 19 <u>eligible to attend a public school; or</u>

1		b. A student who has received a scholarship under the education savings account
2		program until the student graduates high school or reaches twenty-one years of
3		age, regardless of household income.
4	<u>6.</u>	"Parent" means a resident of this state who is a parent, guardian, custodian, or other
5		person with the authority to act on behalf of the child.
6	<u>7.</u>	"Participating school" means any nonpublic school providing education to elementary
7		students, secondary students, or both that, which charges tuition and has notified the
8		administrator of the school's intention to participate in the education savings account
9		program and comply with the education savings account program requirements under
10		this chapter and related administrative rules.
11	<u>8.</u>	"Private tutoring" means qualified professional tutoring services approved by the
12		administrator to receive payment under this chapter.
13	Acc	ount deposits - Parent agreement - Qualified expenses - Enrollment.
14	<u>1.</u>	Beginning with the 2026-27 school year, the Bank of North Dakota annually shall
15		deposit into each education savings account fifty percent of the statewide average
16		amount distributed per student under subsection 5 of section 15.1-27-04.1 for the
17		<del>previous year.</del>
18	<u>2.</u>	The department shall give priority access to the education savings account program to
19		the sibling of a student already enrolled in the education savings account program.
20	<u>3.</u>	A parent of an eligible student qualifies for a state grant to the child's an education
21		savings account child for the student if the parent signs an agreement with the
22		department promising:
23		a. To provide an education for the eligible student in at least the subjects of reading,
24		grammar English language arts, mathematics, social studies, and science;
25		b. Not to enroll the parent's eligible student in a public school or supervise home
26		education under chapter 15.1-23 for the eligible student;
27		c. To use education savings account program funds solely for qualified expenses
28		under this chapter;
29		d. To comply with the requirements outlined in this chapter and any related rules
30		adopted by the Bank of North Dakota; and

1		<u>e.</u>	If the participating student is a child with a disability, to acknowledge the parent
2			has received information from the department and understands participation in
3			the education savings account program qualifies as a parental placement of the
4			parent's child under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act [Pub. L.
5			108-446; 20 U.S.C. 1412(a)(10)(A)] <del>; and</del>
6		<u>f.</u>	To notify the department if the parent's student terminates participation in the
7			education savings account program and enrolls in a public school.
8	<u>4.2.</u>	<u>A p</u>	arent participating in the education savings account program shallmay use the
9		<u>fun</u>	ds deposited in the eligible student's account for any of the following qualifying
10		<u>exp</u>	penses to educate the eligible student:
11		<u>a.</u>	Tuition and fees at a participating school;
12		<u>b.</u>	A textbook required by a participating school;
13		<u>C.</u>	Payment for private tutoring or to another educational service provider;
14		<u>d.</u>	Payment for purchase of curriculum;
15		<u>e.</u>	Tuition or fees for a nonpublic online learning program;
16		<u>f.</u>	Fees for national norm-referenced examinations, advanced placement
17			examinations or similar courses, and any examinations related to college or
18			university admission;
19		<u>g.</u>	Computer hardware, software, or other technological device that is used solely
20			for a student's educational needs and approved by the department or a licensed
21			physician administrator, provided hardware purchased with education savings
22			account funds may not be resold within one yearthree years of purchase;
23		<u>h.</u>	Reasonable fees for transportation paid to a fee-for-service transportation
24			provider for the student to travel to and from an education service provider;
25		<u>i.</u>	Tuition and fees at an eligible postsecondary institution; and
26		<u>j.</u>	A textbook required for college or university courses.
27	<del>5.</del> 3.	<u>A p</u>	articipating school, private tutor, eligible postsecondary institution, or other
28		<u>edu</u>	ucation service provider may not refund, rebate, or share a student's grant with a
29		par	ent or the student in any manner. Any refund must be provided to the administrator
30		who	shall deposit the funds into the appropriate student's education savings account.

1	<del>6.</del> 4.	A parent may make a payment for the cost of educational programs and services not
2		covered by the funds in the child's account.
3	<u>7.</u>	
4	Ban	k of North Dakota - State treasurer - Duties - Transfer.
5	1	The Bank of North Dakota shall:
6		a. Beginning with the 2026-27 school year, annually deposit into each education
7		savings account fifty percent of the statewide average amount distributed per
8		student under subsection 5 of section 15.1-27-04.1 for the previous year.
9	-	b. Qualify an administrator to manage and administer education savings accounts.
10		c. Establish the role and responsibilities of an administrator.
11		d. Conduct or contract for the auditing of accounts and, at a minimum, conduct
12		random audits of accounts on an annual basis. An administrator may conduct the
13		audits. The Bank of North Dakota may determine a parent of an eligible student is
14		ineligible for the education savings account program if the parent substantially
15		misuses the funds in the account.
16	-	e. Refer cases of substantial misuse of funds to law enforcement for investigation, if
17		evidence of fraudulent use of an account is obtained.
18		f. Make deposits into eligible students' education savings accounts on a quarterly
19		<u>basis.</u>
20		g. Adopt rules and procedures under chapter 28-32 for the administration of the
21		education savings account program, as necessary.
22		h. Upon a participating student's graduation from high school or termination of
23		participation in the education savings account program, close the participating
24		student's account and transfer any remaining money in the account to the
25		general fund in the state treasury.
26	2.	The Bank of North Dakota may bar a participating school or education service provider
27		from the education savings account program if the administrator determines the
28		participating school or education service provider has:
29		a. Routinely failed to comply with the accountability standards established under
30		this chapter; or

1. The Bank of North Dakota shall:

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- <u>a.</u> Qualify private financial management firms to manage and administer education savings accounts.
  - <u>b.</u> <u>Conduct or contract for the auditing of accounts and, at a minimum, conduct random audits of accounts on an annual basis. The Bank of North Dakota may make a</u>

6	1. To ensure students are treated fairly and kept safe, each A participating nonpublic
7	school shall:
8	a. Comply with all health and safety laws or codes that apply to nonpublic schools.
9	b. Obtain certification of approval under section 15.1-06-06.1:
20	c. Hold a valid occupancy permit if required by the school's municipality; and.
21	d. Certify the school complies with the nondiscrimination policies under [42 U.S.C.
22	<u>1981].</u>
23	2. To ensure funds are spent appropriately, a participating school shall:
24	a.e. Provide a parent with a receipt for all qualifying expenses at the school.
25	b. Demonstrate the school's financial viability, if the school is to receive fifty
26	thousand dollars or more during the school year, by filing with the administrator
27	before the start of the school year:
28	(1) A surety bond payable to the state in an amount equal to the aggregate
29	amount of the funds from education savings accounts expected to be paid
30	during the school year from students admitted at the participating school; or

1		(2) Financial information demonstrating the school has the ability to pay an
2		aggregate amount equal to the amount of the funds from education savings
3		accounts expected to be paid during the school year to students admitted to
4		the participating school.
5	<u> 3. To</u>	o allow parents and taxpayers to measure the achievements of the education savings
6	<del>a</del>	ccount program:
7	<u> a</u>	. Parents shall ensure:
8		<u>(1) The</u>
9	f	Refund any payment for which a good or service was not provided to the student
10		due to a participating student terminating participation in the education savings
11		account program. A tuition payment must be refunded pro rata determined by the
12		school days remaining in the term for which the tuition was paid. A refund must
13		be paid to the administrator who shall deposit the funds into the appropriate
14		student's education savings account.
15	g	. Ensure the eligible student annually takes the state achievement
16		tests assessments, or other nationally norm-referenced tests, or equivalent tests
17		that, which measure learning gains in mathematics and English language arts,
18		and provide for value-added assessment. If a parent selects the state
19		achievement testassessment, the department shall pay associated costs and
20		materials:
21		<u>(2) The</u>
22	h	. Ensure the results of the tests are provided to the department or an organization
23		chosen by the state on an annual basis;
24		(3) The student information is reported in a way that allows the department to
25		aggregate data by grade level, gender, family income level, and race; and
26		(4) The department, or an organization chosen by the department, is
27		informed of the eligible student's graduation from high school.
28	<u>—b.2.</u> Т	he department, or an organization chosen by the department, shall:
29		(1)a. Ensure compliance with all student privacy laws:
30		— (2)b. Collect all test results;

1	- (3)c. Provide the test results, associated learning gains, and graduation rates to
2	the public on the department's website after the third year of test and graduation-
3	related data collection. The findings must be aggregated by the student's grade
4	level, gender, family income level, number of years of participation in the
5	education savings account program, and race; Data aggregation related to
6	assessments may be limited to the state assessment, as determined necessary
7	by the department.
8	— (4)d. Provide rates for high school graduation, college attendance, and college
9	graduation for participating students to the public on the department's website
10	after the third year of test and test-related data collection; and
11	(5) Administer an annual parental satisfaction survey requesting each parent
12	of a student receiving an education savings account program grant indicate the
13	number of years the child has participated in the education savings account
14	program and express the parent's:
15	(a) Satisfaction with the education savings account program; and
16	(b) Opinions on other topics, items, or issues that may indicate the effectiveness of
17	the education savings account program.
18	4.3. A participating nonpublic school or other education service provider is autonomous
19	and not an agent of the state or federal government and, except as provided under
20	this chapter and in related rules, the:
21	a. The department Department may not regulate the educational program of a
22	participating nonpublic school or education service provider that accepts funds
23	from an education savings account, except as provided under this chapter and
24	<u>chapter 15.1-23;</u>
25	b. The creation Creation of the education savings account program does not expand
26	the regulatory authority of the state, its officers, or a school district to impose an
27	additional regulation of nonpublic schools or education service providers beyond
28	the regulations necessary to enforce the requirements of the education savings
29	account program; and

1	c. Participating nonpublic schools and education service providers must have the
2	freedom to provide for the educational needs of the school's students without
3	governmental control.
4	Department of public instruction - Administrator - Duties.
5	— 1. The administrator shall:
6	<u>a.1.</u> Ensure eligible students and parents are informed annually of the schools that
7	will be participating in the education savings account program.
8	<u>b.2.</u> <u>Create a standard form a parent of an eligible student may submit to establish</u>
9	a student's eligibility for the education savings account program. The administrator
10	shall ensure the application is readily available to interested families through various
11	sources, including the department's website.
12	— <u>c.3.</u> Accept applications on a year-round basis and shall approve applications in a
13	reasonable time frame.
14	<u>d.4.</u> Execute a multimedia marketing program targeting eligible families, especially
15	those below the state's median household income, informing the families about the
16	education savings account program and how to apply.
17	<u>e.5.</u> Establish a web and phone-based support system providing parents with
18	education savings account program application support and ongoing account
19	maintenance support.
20	2. The department may bar a participating school or education service provider from the
21	education savings account program if the department determines the participating
22	school or education provider has:
23	a. Routinely failed to comply with the accountability standards established under
24	this chapter; or
25	<u>b.</u> <u>Failed to provide the eligible student with the educational services funded by the </u>
26	education savings account.
27	3. If the department bars a participating school or education provider from the education
28	savings account program, the department shall notify eligible students and parents of
29	the decision as quickly as possible. A parent may appeal a decision of the department
30	under chapter 28-32

1 The department shall adopt rules and procedures as necessary for the administration 2 of the education savings account program. 3 Provide to the parent of a participating student a written explanation of the allowable 4 uses of education savings accounts, the responsibilities of the parent, and the duties 5 of the administrator. 6 Ensure the department is informed of a participating student's graduation from high 7 school or a participating student's termination of participation in the education savings 8 account program. 9 Coordinate with the Bank of North Dakota to develop procedures to implement the 10 program in accordance with this chapter and related rules. 11 Upon request, determine whether an expense is allowable. 12 10. Establish a procedure for a participating school to provide data to the department as 13 required under this chapter. 14 Administer an annual parental satisfaction survey requesting each parent of a student 15 receiving an education savings account program grant indicate the number of years 16 the child has participated in the education savings account program and express the 17 parent's: 18 Satisfaction with the education savings account program; and 19 Opinions on other topics, items, or issues that may indicate the effectiveness of 20 the education savings account program. 21 School districts of residence - Duties. 22 The school district of residence: 23 <u>1.</u> Shall provide a participating school or education service provider that has admitted an 24 eligible student under this chapter with a complete copy of the student's school 25 records, while complying with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 26 [20 U.S.C. Section 1232(q)]. 27 <u>2.</u> May provide transportation for an eligible student to and from the participating school 28 or education service provider under the same conditions as the school district of 29 residence is required to provide transportation for other resident students to nonpublic 30 schools. The school district of residence qualifies for state transportation aid for each 31 student transported.

# 1 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA - EDUCATION SAVINGS

- 2 **ACCOUNT PROGRAM.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the
- 3 state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$40,000,000, or so much of the sum as
- 4 may be necessary, to the Bank of North Dakota for the purpose of funding the education
- 5 savings account program beginning in the school year 2026-27, for the biennium beginning
- 6 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.
- 7 **SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.** Section 1 of this Act becomes effective on July 1, 2026.
