4	SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 14-15-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
5	created and enacted as follows:			
6	Notwithstanding any other provision in this section, an adoptive parent may petition			
7	the court to relinquish parental rights of an adopted child if extreme circumstances			
8	<u>exi</u>	exist.		
9	<u>a.</u>	<u>For</u>	purposes of this subsection, "extreme circumstances" means the:	
10		<u>(1)</u>	Adopted child has been diagnosed with a severe mental health condition or	
11			behavioral health disorder by a licensed child psychologist or psychiatrist;	
12		<u>(2)</u>	Adopted child has committed an act of a violent or sexual nature against	
13			another family member living in the household which if committed by an	
14			adult would be considered a crime under the laws of this state; and	
15		<u>(3)</u>	Adoptive parent is unable to provide proper control of the adopted child and	
16			is in imminent fear for the safety of a family member living in the same	
17			household as the adopted child.	
18	<u>b.</u>	<u>If th</u>	e court finds credible evidence that extreme circumstances exist, there is a	
19		<u>reb</u> ı	uttable presumption the adoptive parent's petition to relinquish parental rights
