- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 15.1 of the North Dakota Century
- 2 Code, relating to the establishment of the education savings account program; and to provide
- 3 an appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** A new chapter to title 15.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 6 enacted as follows:
- 7 Definitions.
- 8 As used in this chapter:
- 9 <u>1. "Eligible student" means an elementary or secondary student attending public school</u>
- or private school or receiving home education who is a resident of this state and
- eligible to attend a public school, including a student who has received a scholarship
- 12 <u>under the education savings account program, if the student has not graduated from</u>
- high school or reached twenty-one years of age.
- 14 2. "Parent" means parent or legal guardian.
- 15 <u>3.</u> "Qualified educational expenses" means:
- 16 <u>a. Tuition and fees at a nonpublic school;</u>
- 17 <u>b. Textbooks, fees, or payments for educational therapies, including tutoring or cognitive skills training;</u>
- 19 <u>c.</u> <u>Curriculum fees, software, and materials for a course of study for a specific</u>
- 20 <u>subject matter or grade level;</u>
- 21 <u>d. Tuition or fees for nonpublic online education programs;</u>

1		<u>e.</u>	Tuition for vocational and life skills education approved by the superintendent of
2			education;
3		<u>f.</u>	Education materials and services for students with disabilities from an accredited
4			provider, including the cost of paraprofessionals and assistants who are trained in
5			accordance with state law;
6		<u>g.</u>	Standardized test fees and advanced placement examinations or examinations
7			related to postsecondary education admission or credentialing;
8		<u>h.</u>	Tuition or fees for dual-credit courses;
9		<u>i.</u>	Meals served to students in school buildings;
10		<u>j.</u>	Mental health assistance;
11		<u>k.</u>	Medical appointments necessary for educational benefit;
12		<u>l.</u>	Educational camps; and
13		<u>m.</u>	Qualified expenses as adopted by the superintendent of public instruction in
14			administrative rules.

17	<u>1.</u>	<u>The</u>	superintendent of public instruction is the education savings account program
18		<u>adn</u>	ninistrator.
19	<u>2.</u>	<u>For</u>	an eligible student, the superintendent of public instruction shall establish an
20		<u>indi</u>	vidual account for the eligible student and deposit any payment the student is
21		<u>enti</u>	tled to into the eligible student's individual account no later than July fifteenth of
22		<u>eac</u>	th year. The funds must be available immediately for the payment of qualified
23		<u>edu</u>	cational expenses incurred by the parent for the eligible student during the fiscal
24		yea	<u>r.</u>
25	<u>3.</u>	<u>Beg</u>	ginning with the school budget year beginning July 1, 2026, for each school year,
26		an e	eligible student:
27		<u>a.</u>	Shall receive an education savings account payment of one thousand dollars, if
28			the eligible student's household has an annual income less than or equal to three
29			hundred percent of the most recently revised poverty income guidelines
30			published by the United States department of health and human services; and
31		b.	May receive any federal scholarship for educational choice.

1	<u>4.</u>	Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, the superintendent of public
2		instruction, parents, and eligible students shall comply with any federal law or rule
3		upon which receiving a federal scholarship for educational choice is contingent. The
4		education savings accounts under this chapter may be used to facilitate any federal
5		educational choice program.
6	SEC	CTION 2. APPROPRIATION - SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION -
7	EDUCA.	TION SAVINGS ACCOUNT PROGRAM. There is appropriated out of any moneys in
8	the gene	eral fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,000,000, or so
9	much of	the sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the
10	purpose	of administering the education savings account program, for the biennium beginning
11	July 1, 2	025, and ending June 30, 2027.
