3 - Bill and Fiscal Impact Summary

Provide a brief summary of the measure, including description of the provisions having fiscal impact (limited to 300 characters).

Changes 14 fee categories charged by the Board and also changes the Private Security Training Certificate from a onetime fee to an initial fee with renewal and late fees. The Board estimates a total increase in revenue of \$110,430 per biennium, and increased expenditures of \$50,000 per biennium.

4 - Fiscal Impact Sections Detail

Section 1 of SB 2051 amends N.D.C.C. 43-30-16 setting the Board's examination, license, and registration fees. SB 2051 amends this statute as follows: (1) Changes the fee to be paid by an applicant for an examination to determine the applicant's fitness to receive a license as a private investigator or a license to provide private security services from \$100 to \$150, changes fee to be paid by an applicant for the initial issuance or the renewal of a license as a

private investigator or a license to provide private security services from \$150 to \$225 and also changes the late fee from \$50 to \$75 for each month, changes fee to be paid by an applicant to apply for a license to conduct a private security or detective agency from \$100 to \$150, changes fee for the issuance or the renewal of a license to conduct a private security or detective agency from \$300 to \$450 and also changes the late fee from \$100 to \$150 for each month, changes the onetime fee to an initial fee to be paid by an applicant for the issuance of a private security training certificate from \$25 to \$40 and requires a renewal fee annually of \$40 and a late fee of \$15, changes the annual fee to be paid by an applicant for the issuance of an armed certificate from \$30 to \$45 and increases the late fee from \$10 to \$15, changes the fee to be paid for the issuance of a duplicate license from \$20 to \$30, changes the initial registration fee to provide private investigative service or private security service from \$30 to \$45 and increases the late fee from \$10 to \$15, changes the initial application fee for a certified course instructor for an armed first responder training certification from \$400 to \$600 and changes the renewal fee from \$300 to \$400.

The Board estimates approximately 12 examination applicate fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$600 annually or \$1,200 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 116 Private Investigator and Security Provider Licenses for an estimated revenue increase of \$8,700 annually or \$17,400 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 5 Private Investigator and Security Provider License late fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$125 annually or \$250 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 8 Agency Application fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$400 annually or \$800 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 89 Agency License fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$13,350 annually or \$26,700 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 89 Security Trainer fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$3,560 annually or \$7,120 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 3 Security Trainer late fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$45 annually or \$90 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 262 Armed Certification fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$3,930 annually or \$7,860 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 10 Armed Certification late fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$150 annually or \$300 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 5 Duplicate License fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$50 annually or \$100 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 1,587 Private Investigator & Security Registration fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$23,805 annually or \$47,610 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 30 Private Investigator & Security Registration late fees for an estimated revenue increase of \$150 annually or \$300 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 1 Armed First Responder Initial fee for an estimated revenue increase of \$200 annually or \$400 per biennium. The Board estimates approximately 1 Armed First Responder renewal for an estimated revenue increase of \$150 annually or \$300 per biennium.

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The Board is self-funded.

Historically the Board has had 2 employees. For the last 4 years the Board has been operating with 1 employee mainly due to budget constraints. The Board has seen increased legal and operating expenses. The lack of Board staff has contributed a backlog the Board was and is dealing with. The increase expenditures would be to hire a .5 FTE position to assist with clearing the backlog and for day-to-day Board operations. The estimated cost of this position would be about \$25,000 annually or \$50,000 per biennium. The increased revenue will also be utilized towards Board solvency and mitigating current operating expenses.
