A quorum was declared by the President.

REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEE SB 2201

Finance and Taxation Committee (Sen. Weber, Chairman) recommends **AMENDMENTS** (25.0308.04001) and when so amended, recommends **DO PASS** and **BE REREFERRED** to the **Appropriations Committee** (6 YEAS, 0 NAYS, 0 ABSENT AND NOT VOTING). FIRST READING OF SENATE BILLS

Sens. Myrdal, Sorvaag, Thomas introduced:

SB 2347: A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 53-06.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to historic horse race wagering and pari-mutuel horse racing; and to amend and reenact sections 53-06.2-01, 53-06.2-04, 53-06.2-05, 53-06.2-06, 53-06.2-07, 53-06.2-08, 53-06.2-10, 53-06.2-10.1, and 53-06.2-11 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the authorization of historic horse race wagering and the elimination of simulcast dog racing under the certificate system.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Judiciary Committee**.

Sens. Weston, Cleary, Paulson and Reps. K. Anderson, S. Olson, Fisher introduced:

SB 2348: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 and a new section to chapter 26.1-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the acceptance of health care sharing ministries by an institution of higher education and health care sharing ministries' exemptions from insurance laws and regulations.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Industry and Business Committee**.
