SB 2253: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 39-06.1-06, and a new section to chapter 39-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the use of an engine compression brake device; to amend and reenact section 39-06.1-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of a moving violation; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

SB 2260: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 47-20.2-01, 47-20.2-02, 47-20.2-05, and 47-20.2-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the North Dakota coordinate system zones.

Was read the first time and referred to the State and Local Government Committee.

Sen. Magrum and Reps. S. Olson, Hendrix introduced:

SB 2315: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to restrictions on legislative lobbyists; to amend and reenact section 54-05.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to penalties for legislative lobbyists; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the State and Local Government Committee.

Sens. Castaneda, Cory, Hogue and Reps. Louser, M. Ruby introduced:

SB 2349: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to limitations on the introduction of legislative bills prepared by executive branch agencies and the judicial branch.

Was read the first time and referred to the State and Local Government Committee.

Sens. Paulson, Burckhard, Castaneda and Reps. Fisher, D. Johnston, Louser introduced:

SB 2350: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 44-04-18.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an exemption from open records for employee performance and discipline records contained in personnel records.

Was read the first time and referred to the Workforce Development Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Klein's motion.
