Housing incentive fund (HIF)	fund to HIF for homelessness programs, transfers \$25 million from the strategic investment and improvements fund (SIIF) to HIF for housing programs, and designates \$150,000 for a grant to an organization for a Native American homelessness liaison.	Section 6 appropriates and transfers \$10 million from the general fund to HIF for homelessness programs and transfers \$33.65 million from the strategic investment and improvements fund (SIIF) to HIF for housing programs (\$20 million), a grant to an organization for a Native American homelessness liaison (\$150,000), and (\$13.5 million) for a rent stabilization program. Section 15 identifies \$1,200,983 from the housing incentive fund for homelessness program and rent stabilization program positions. Section 24 amends the housing incentive fund to allow moneys in the fund to be used for administrative expenses subject to legislative appropriation.
